1 By 11 with a large sea one sail in sight middle Port

all sail at 8 am took ship to the SE lat 16:24 North

47 First Port light airs from the NW lat Stead By 11
employed in ships duty middle and latter Port light
airs and variable 2 sail in sight
variation 1 Point Westerly lat 13:22 North
long By 11 25:39 West

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Remarks on Board Saturday September 17. 1836

48 First Port light airs from the North Course 1 By 11
With all sail set 2 sail in sight middle Port fine
winds from the NW latter Port winds 2 By 11
Variation 1 Point Westerly lat By 11 11:59 North
long By 11 25:08 West

Remarks on Board Sunday September 18. 1836

49 The 24 hours begins with brisk winds from the
2 By 11 Stead 1 By 11 one sail in sight middle and
latter Port more moderate saw finbacks 2 sail
Variation 1 Point Westerly lat By 11 10:08 North
long By 11 24:49 West

Remarks on Board Monday September 19. 1836

50 First Port light winds from the SE Stead By 11
1 By 11 one sail in sight saw Black fish found
in chase of the same but could not come up with them
at 4 pm saw Black fish got one middle and
latter Port light airs and calm 4 sail in sight
Variation 1 Point Westerly lat By 11 10:00 North
long By 11 24:29 West

51 First Port light airs from the NW Course 1 By 11
With all sail set middle Port squally latter Port fine
breeze and chop employed in hunting Black fish 1
sail in sight Variation 1 Point Westerly lat By 11 8:48 North
long By 11 23:48 West

Remarks on Board Wednesday September 21. 1836

52 The 24 hours moderate winds from the North
Stead 1 By 11 with all drawing sail set
employed in ships duty at 8 am Spoke a
Dutch Bark from Holland bound to
Montevideo 2 sail lat By 11 7:48 North
long By 11 23:08 West
