Remarks on Board Monday November 25 1836

- 121 First Part Strong Gale from the West heading by WBS with Port reef Tapsails accompanied with rain at 1 Am winds head to the N & P where thick fog the wind with strong squalls of snow and orange sea Variation 2 Points Eastward So Ends
 Lat By obs 87° 50' South
 Long By account 78° 20' West

Remarks on Board Tuesday November 26 1836

- 122 First Part Strong Gale from the WSW heading by WBS with Port reef Tapsails at 4 Pm where ship to the SW by 4 winds head at 2 am winds head to the SW where thick and strong wind by 4 with strong squalls of wind and snow Variation 2 Points Eastward
 Lat By obs 87° 04' South
 Long By account 78° 30' West

Remarks on Board Wednesday November 30 1836

- 123 First and Middle Part Strong Gale from the SW by 4 Head WSW with Port reef Tapsails accompanied with snow squalls and a large sea latter Part calm employed in Bending a gybe and other ship's duty Variation 2 Points Eastward
 Lat By obs 88° 48' South
 Long By account 79° 10' West

Remarks on Board Thursday December 1 1836

- 124 First Part Brisk Winds from the West heading with all clewing sail set at midnight winds head to the WSW heading by 1st accompanied with fog at 1 am winds head to the WSW heading by 1st Variation 2 Points Eastward Lat by account 88° 07' South
 Long By account 80° 53' West

Remarks on Board Friday December 2 1836

- 125 First Part Brisk winds from the West heading by 1st at 7 Pm winds head to the WSW heading by 1st at 4 am winds head to the WSW heading by 1st strong gale blowing two with a Port reef main Tapsails and Storm stay sails Variation 2 Points Eastward
 Lat By obs 87° 48' South
 Long By account 81° 53' West

Remarks on Board Saturday December 3 1836

- 126 First Part Strong Gale from the West heading by 1st by 1st middle Part more moderate at 2 am saw a bridge standing to the North where ship and set the Tapsails double reef so on Lat by obs 87° 38' South
 Long By account 82° 00' West

Remarks on Board Sunday December 4 1836

- 127 First Part Strong Gale from the W by 1st heading by North at 7 Pm winds head WSW where ship to the SW by 4 with Port reef Tapsails at 4 am where ship to the W by 4 and at 8 where ship to the SW by 4 the bridge in company Lat by account 87° 28' South
 Long By account 82° 10' West

Remarks on Board Monday December 8 1836

- 128 all the 24 hours Brisk winds from the WSW heading by 1st by 1st with Port reef Tapsails with thick hazy weather out consort in company
 Lat By account 88° 08' South
 Long By account 83° 27' West
