Remarks on Board Sunday January 10

- 164 First Port moderate winds from the South stood W by N at 1 Pm stood West with light air from the East at 7 am saw sperm whales found got one at 11 am took him a long side. So ends now all this day found in sight 20 miles off

Remarks on Board Wednesday January 11

- 165 at 1 Pm commenced cutting at 3 the boat returned had struck and parted the line at 4 Pm where ship to the SW with care along side at 7 where ship in there and cut in the cable at 10 finished employed in boiling mud ball and stood by East. Lat by obs 16° 00 South long by obs 74° 56 West the land 20 miles off

Remarks on Board Thursday January 12

- 166 This 24 hours fine weather stood W by N at 1 Pm saw a Sloop in there standing to the East employed in boiling saw humbacks and finbacks at 7 Pm stood by East at 9 am stood West the land 30 miles off Lat by obs 18° 40 South long by obs 78° 38 West

Remarks on Board Friday January 13 1837

- 167 First stood West at 7 Pm stood East at 9 Pm finished boiling at day light did not see finbacks at 8 saw a ship steering West supposed to be a whaler. Lat by obs 18° 26 South long by obs 76° 32 West

Remarks on Board Saturday January 14 1837

- 168 First and middle Port brack winds from the SE stood W by N at 7 Pm shortened sail heading NW by N at midnight where ship at day light stood West at 7 am saw a sail. Lat by obs 14° 38 South long by obs 74° 18 West

Remarks on Board Sunday January 15 1837

- 168 First Port moderate winds from the South stood W by N at 7 Pm stood East at 9 Pm spoke the ship Stanton Dilos of Fairhaven got hogs out 150 lbs at 10 am where ship to the SW at 6 am stood W by N saw finback. Lat by obs 14° 18 South long 76° 40 West

Remarks on Board January Monday 16 1837

- 170 This 24 hours brack winds from the SE by E stood W by N at 12. Lat by obs 14° 18 South long 76° 40 West the two small Islands of Disco bearing W by E 35 miles distant at 4 Pm where ship to the Stanton in company at daylight commenced bracking out the main hole to stow oil. So ends Lat by obs 14° 24 West long 78° 28 West

Remarks on Board Tuesday January 17 1837

- 171 This 24 hours brack the fair employed in stowing oil in the main hole 128 lbs at 12 Pm finished now all this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday January 18 1837

- 172 First Port of the 24 hours fine weather stood W by N at 6 Pm lay two at daylight stood North saw black fish found but did not succeed in getting any. Lat by obs 14° 14 South long by obs 78° 40 West

Remarks on Board Thursday January 19 1837

- 173 all the 24 hours moderate pleasant weather stood North lay two three the night saw humbacks. So ends Lat by obs 13° 30 South long by obs 78° 38 West
