Remarks on Board Sunday February 3 1839

First and middle part strong gale at West
heading E by S under short reef main topmast
and fore topmast stay sail. Last part more
moderate at 9 am board ship to the West
No land. Sun obscure

Remarks on Board Monday February 4 1839

First part steady E by W at 8 PM
board ship to the E by S at midnight board
to the S by E wind. At 7 PM board to the
W by S at 11 am board to the West with
fine weather

Lat by obs 18° 28' South

Long by Chron. 170° 04' West

Remarks on Board Tuesday February 5 1839

First and middle part fine weather last part
strong winds and a large swell wind E
and W by E Steady by W and W by S
Intermittent in night blowing North East 40 miles

Sun obscure

Remarks on Board Wednesday February 6 1839

First part steady by E by S with gentle breeze
winds E by S at 6 PM took the fore and
main topmasts and foremast and shot red
the main board ship to the West at 2 am
took in the main boat with strong gale
at 6 am sent in the flying jib boom

Sun obs fine

Remarks on Board Thursday February 7 1839

all this day strong gale from the West
and a large sea First and middle part
lay by with short reef main topmast at 8
am Steady E by S and set the foremast

Long by Chron. 170° 04' West

Remarks on Board Friday February 8 1839

First part strong gale at West Steady
E by S at 6 PM lay by heading S by E at
8 am Steady E by S and more moderate
variation 1/3 Point Eastward

Lat by obs 18° 48' South

Long by Chron. 168° 53' West

Remarks on Board Saturday February 9 1839

First part brisk winds at West and S by E
Lows E by S at 6 PM double reef the foremast
last part fine weather with a large swell
Steady East Change the fore topmast

Lat by obs 18° 43' South

Long by Chron. 167° 02' West

Remarks on Board Sunday February 10 1839

This day fine winds at West (Lows E by S)

Lat by obs 18° 38' South

Long by Chron. 165° 11' West

Remarks on Board Monday February 11 1839

First and middle part fine weather Lows East
last part squally

Lat by obs 18° 40' South

Long by Chron. 163° 20' West

Remarks on Board Tuesday February 12 1839

First and middle part fine weather Steady East
and E by S last part squally winds West Steady
E by S

Lat by account 18° 54' South

Long by account 161° 10' West

Remarks on Board Wednesday February 13 1839

First part Steady E by S at 6 PM Steady E by S
at 1 PM lay two heading South at 9 am
Steady East winds West with a heavy of rain

Lat by account 16° 04' South

Long by account 157° 51' West

Remarks on Board Thursday February 14 1839

all this day fine weather winds West
Steady East at 8 am Steady E by S employed
in Rattling the Ripping

Lat by obs 16° 20' South

Long by Chron. 158° 09' West
