 Lat 19 1/2 N Long 24 20 W Fine weather all
 this day with fresh breezes from S.E. The first
 and middle parts, course S.W. under double
 reefed top sails and fore sail, boiling the latter
 part strong breezes from S.W. course S.W. and
 several days in sight of the Island of St.
 Antonio West end now 15 miles distant at
 the close of this day &

Thursday November 11th
 Lat 16 58 N Long 20 30 W Clear weather
 The ship, becalmed of St Antonio at 11 AM
 finished boiling the first part and drove
 up the whale turned up 25 fms. The
 latter part spoke bark Draco brother
 sail in sight and so ends

Friday November 12th
 No Obstr. Fine weather all the day
 The ship becalmed of St Antonio at 2 P.M. got
 a breeze from S.W. course S.W. all sail set
 The Draco in company The latter part the
 Island of Prava in sight at 11 AM The captain
 went on shore to leave the ship off and on
 And so ends

Saturday November 13th
 No Obstr. Fine weather all this day with
 light breezes from S.W. all this day. The ship off
 and on at Prava all these 24 hours. The boat
 on shore. The Draco in company And so ends

Sunday November 14th
 No Obstr. Fine weather all this day with
 fresh breezes from S.W. The ship off and on at
 Prava all this day And so ends

Monday November 15th
 No Obstr. Clear weather with strong
 breezes from S.W. The ship under double reefed
 top sail, off and on at Prava all this day and
 so ends

Tuesday November 16th
 No Obstr. Clear weather all this day with strong
 breezes from S.W. The ship off on at Prava trading
 got a lot of hogs. And shipped a number of men
 on boat in coming off cap sail and all the loads
 went to port, sent on shore 4 bbls and 9 bags of flour
 one deer's pork one bbl molasses 10 pieces cloth

Wednesday November 17th
 No Obstr. Clear weather all this day with
 strong breezes from S.W. The ship off and on at
 Prava. The mate departed this day. Lost 2000
 oranges 20 bunches of bananas 100 lbs of fresh beef by
 the boat that turned over coming off. got 12 hogs
 all told, shipped another 2 mates. The captain came
 off at the close of this day. And kept of course
 S.W. And so ends

Thursday November 18th
 No Obstr. Fine weather with fresh breezes
 from S.W. course S.W. until 4 P.M. then the
 remainder of the day. The mate employed in
 making out, sent for the penmen. Shipped 11 more fowls
 and sent a boat steered

Friday November 19th
 No Obstr. Overcast most of this day with
 fresh breezes from S.W. course S.W. All day
 all sail set. The mate employed in ship's duty
 And so ends

Saturday November 20th
 No Obstr. Overcast most of this day with fresh
 breezes from S.W. the first and middle parts course
 S.W. the latter part calm and light breeze from different
 quarters. With rain squalls. The ship heading to S.W.
 And so ends
