Tuesday February 15th

this day with fresh breeze from S.W. to S.E.
The ship steered by the wind and heading to
N.W. the first part the middle and latter
parts S.W. The light sails in 10 or 12 ends

Wednesday February 16th
Lat 9 05 Longitude 10 06 Fine weather all
this day with fresh breeze from S.E. Course
S.W. all day. No smoke seen. Course of Ben
Bedford. The light sails in most of the day
Bark Boned 10 months out 9 30 1/2 pm

Thursday February 17th

Sunday February 20th
No Obv. Overcast the first part the

from S.E. The first and latter part the middle
part light breeze from the same quarter. The
ship steered by the wind all day and on differ-
ent tacks. St Helena in sight to the W. 20 or 30
miles distant and a number of sail 10 or 12 ends

Monday February 21st
No Obv. Clear weather all this day with
fresh breezes blowing in gusts the first and latter
parts. The ship steered by the wind and on different
tacks during the day heading S on one and S.W. on
the other tack. The light sails in most of
the day. St Helena in sight to the W. 20 or 30
miles distant. The watch employed in repairing
masts, top gallant sail and spanker and rounds
