

Tuesday) February 26th 1833. Strong Westerly winds & pleasant weather with a head beat Sea. At 3 P.M. took a Lunar Observation and the Longitude deduced was 43° 45' W. Lat Obs 41° 20' S Long 44° 00' W.

Wednesday) Feb 27th Fresh gales and pleasant weather. Turned out ruffs and set the 1st Sail. The water discolored, being of a Tea green. Lat Obs 42° 00' S Long 46° 40' W.

Thursday) Feb 28. Variable windy & squally weather with rain thunder and lightning the first 18 hours. Latter part fresh breeze & clear. Lat Obs 42° 48' S Long 49° 17' W.

Friday) March 1st Fresh gales and cloudy with squalls. Double reefed Topsails. Wind Westerly. Lat Obs 43° 35' S Long 51° 16' W.

Saturday March 2nd Fresh gales and fair weather. James Prime one of the Crew while coming from off the Bowsprit fell overboard. Threw a back, cleared away the Harbour Boat & succeeded in saving him. Wind  W & W to SW. Lat Obs 44° 18' S Long 51° 55' W.

Sunday March 3rd Strong gales from the Westward. Bent a new Fore topsail. At 2 P.M. hove too under close reefed Main topsail. Latter part more moderate. At 6 A.M. set Courses & double reefed Topsails. Took in the Boats and lashed them over the Try works. Put the old Boats on the Starboard & Larboard quarters. Lat Obs 44° 29' S Long 51° 55' W.

Monday) March 4th Pleasant weather & moderate gales from N.W. to West. Lat Obs 45° 25' S Long 53° 54' W.

Tuesday) March 5th Fresh gales from NW and pleasant weather. Bent a new Fore Course. Lat Obs 46° 39' S Long 54° 20' W.

Wednesday) March 6th Fresh gales from W & W and cool pleasant weather. Lat Obs 46° 58' S Long 55° 31' W.

Thursday) March 7th Fresh gales from West & W & W & pleasant weather. Lat Obs 47° 37' S Long 56° 40' W.

Friday) March 8th First part fresh breeze & pleasant. At 5 P.M. the wind hauled to the Northward and continued increasing till 5 A.M. when it backed to SW and continued blowing a tremendous gale. Lay too under close

reefed Main Topsail & Main Staysail. At noon took in Main Topsail and while furling it, ^{the gale} parted in the Slugs. Secured it until the gale abated. Lat Obs 46° 01' S Long 57° 35' W.

Saturday) March 9th 1833. First part a severe gale from SW & S.W. Sent down the 1st & 2nd Yards. Latter part more moderate. Sent down the Broken Main topsail and rigged and sent aloft a new one. Lat Obs 45° 46' S Long 56° 50' W.

Sunday) March 10th First part moderate & pleasant. Made all Sails. Latter part blowing a gale. Lay too under close reefed Main Topsail. Wind SW. Lat Obs 46° 35' S Long 57° 21' W.

Monday) March 11th First part severe gales from W & W. At 4 P.M. the water being discolored sounded with 30 fathoms line & no bottom. Middle & Latter part pleasant & moderating. Made Sail. Lat Obs 45° 02' S Long 57° 50' W.

Tuesday) March 12th Fresh gales with rain. Latter part pleasant. Set down, topmast & top 4th Steering Sails. Wind North & foggy. No observation. Sun obscured Long 59° 01' W.

Wednesday) March 13th Fine breeze from North and N.E. & pleasant weather with a smooth Sea. Saw several right Whales. Sounded with 30 fathoms, no bottom. At 10.40 A.M. took a Lunar Observation and the Longitude deduced was 58° 53' W. Lat Obs 46° 26' S Longitude 59° 00' W.

Thursday) March 14th Fresh Northerly breeze & pleasant weather. Saw a large number of Birds. Caught a Porpoise. Sounded at midnight with 30 fathoms, no bottom. Sounded at noon and got bottom 75 fathoms fine black & grey mixed sand. Lat Obs 48° 20' S Long 60° 05' W.

Friday) March 15th First part light winds and calm. Latter part fresh N.W. breeze. At 10.40 A.M. took a Lunar Observation and the Longitude deduced was 62° 51' W. Lat Obs 50° 25' S Long 62° 48' W.

Saturday) March 16th Commenced fine Northerly breeze & pleasant weather. At 1.40 P.M. took a Lunar Observation & the Longitude deduced 62° 48' W. At 5 P.M. experienced a sudden & tremendous squall from the North. accompanied with large hail stones. It hove the Ship down so that the lee Boats were in the water before we got Sail in.
