

Sunday September 22 1833. Pleasant weather and moderate breezes. Steered to the S.W. till 9 A.M. then tacked & steered by the wind to the E.N. Saw nothing. Lat Obs 4° 44' S. Longitude 90° 18' W.

Monday Sept 23

Moderate breezes & pleasant weather. Steered to the E.N. by the wind. At 4 P.M. took a set of Lunar Observations & the Longitude deduced was 90° 02' W. Tacked to the S.W. at sundown and to the E.N. at daylight. Lat Obs 4° 43' S. Longitude 89° 00' W.

Tuesday Sept 24

Moderate breezes and hazy weather. Steered to the E.N. by the wind. At 8 A.M. tacked to the S.W. At noon saw Sperm Whales from the Main by Thos Francis. Lowered three Boats in pursuit. Lat Obs 4° 57' S. Long 88° 35' W.

Wednesday Sept 25

Begins light breezes and fair weather. At 2 P.M. the Starboard Boat killed a small whale & brought it along side. Made it fast with the fluke chain. At 6 P.M. the larboard Boat brought her whale alongside which we made fast with the fluke chain. Took up the Boats and steered to the East by the wind under topsails. At daylight commenced cutting in the Whales. Saw a Ship to the Northward. At 8.30 A.M. had the Blubber & Heads of both whales on board. Set all Sail by the wind & steered to the S.W. Lat. pr obs 4° 37' S.

Thursday Sept 26 Fine pleasant weather & moderate trade wind. Steering to the S.W. by the wind. At 6.30 P.M. spoke Ship Ann. Parry, Recd, of Portsmouth N.H. 3 months out 120 Bbls Oil. At 6 P.M. tacked to the E.N. Lat Obs 4° 33' S.

Friday Sept 27

Pleasant weather & moderate winds. Finished trying out the whale, which made about 30 Bbls Oil. Steering by the wind. Saw Blackfish. Lat Obs 4° 41' S. Long 88° 30' W.

Saturday Sept 28

Gentle gales and fair weather. Steering to the E.N. by the wind. Ship Ann Parry in company. Saw Blackfish, Porpoises & Finbacks. Lat Obs 4° 15' S. Long 86° 55' W.

Sunday September 29 1833 Gentle gales and fine weather. At 4 P.M. came on colored water. Steered to the E.N. by the wind. At 9 A.M. tacked to the S.W. Tacked company with Ship Ann Parry. Saw Blackfish & Porpoises. Lat Obs 4° 03' S. Long 86° 05' W.

Monday Sept 30 Gentle gales and fine weather. Steering to the S.W. & W.S.W. Saw Blackfish & Porpoises Lat Obs 4° 24' S. Long 87° 06' W.

Tuesday October 1 1833 Fresh breezes and a hazy atmosphere.

Steered to the Westward & by the wind to the S.W. through the night under short sail. At 7 A.M. saw Sperm Whales from the Main by Isaac Parker. Lowered the three Boats in pursuit. At 10 A.M. larboard Boat got one small whale which was secured alongside with the fluke chain. At 11 A.M. waist Boat got a large whale which was secured alongside with the fluke chain. Guts in the small whale. Lat Obs 4° 22' S. Long 87° 13' W.

Wednesday October 2. First part fresh breezes & cloudy weather. Commenced cutting in the large whale & at 10 P.M. had the Blubber, Head & Case on board. Wore Ship made Sail and steered to the S.W. by the wind. Saw nothing. Lat Obs 4° 25' S. Longitude Chronom. 87° 14' W.

Thursday Oct 3. Moderate breezes and pleasant weather with passing clouds. Trying out Oil. Saw nothing. Steered by the wind to the S.W. & at 8 A.M. wore to the E.N. Lat Obs 4° 36' S. Long Chronom 87° 55' W.

Friday Oct 4. Moderate breezes and a hazy atmosphere. Steered to the E.N. by the wind. At 7 A.M. finished trying out the whales. The two made about 80 Bbls. All hands employed stowing down Oil. Saw nothing. Lat Obs 4° 08' S. Long. 87° 40' W.

Saturday Oct 5. Fresh breezes and occasional squalls. At 3 P.M. tacked to the S.W. Stowing down Oil & cleaning Ship. Lat Obs 4° 32' S.
