

Sunday April 6th 1834. Moderate breezes & fair weather. Steered to S & W. At 6 A.M. tacked to E & N. Saw a Finback Ship Frances in sight. Lat Obs 4° 28' S Long 105° 50' W

Monday April 7th 1834. Light winds & pleasant weather. Steered to Eastward by the wind. Saw a Finback. At daylight saw a Ship to windward & one supposed to be the Frances astern. All hands employed towing down Oil. Lat Obs 4° 13' S Long 105° 00' W

Tuesday April 8th. Light winds & clear pleasant weather. At 4 P.M. saw a Ship off the weather beam. Steered to the Eastward. At 8 A.M. tacked to S & W. Lat Obs 4° 43' S Long 105° 00' W

Wednesday April 9th. Light winds & Calms and pleasant weather. Steered to S & E. At 4 P.M. & E & S. Two Ships in sight off the lee bow & ahead. Saw Grampuses. Lat Obs 4° 30' S Long 105° 15' W

Thursday April 10th. Light winds & Calms & pleasant weather. Steered to S & W. Tacking Ship & Boats. Two Ships in sight. Lat Obs 5° 07' S Long 106° 00' W

Friday April 11th. First part calm. Middle & Latter part brisk S & trade & pleasant weather. Saw nothing. Lat Obs 5° 02' S Long 106° 00' W

Saturday April 12th. Moderate breezes & pleasant weather. Steered to E & N. Unlashed the Fore Couvel to repair. At 11.30 A.M. raised a sperm whale from the Main by Franklin. At noon lowered the Boats. Lat Obs 4° 15' S

Sunday April 13th. Light breezes & fair weather. The Boats in pursuit of a lone whale. Starboard Boat fastened and afterwards the other Boats. At 3 P.M. got him alongside and commenced cutting in. At 8 P.M. had the blubber on board. At 11 P.M. commenced boiling. Latter part light airs & calm

and small Showers of rain. Took on board part of the Head & bailed the Case. At 11.30 A.M. made all Sail and steered to the Eastward. wind, North Easterly. Lat Obs 3° 55' S Long 107° 30' W

Monday April 14th 1834. Light winds & pleasant weather. Steered to the S & E by the wind. Wind inclining South by East. Saw a Finback. At Noon finished trying out the whale making about 30 Bbls. Lat Obs 4° 54' S Long 107° 30' W

Tuesday April 15th. Moderate breezes & pleasant. Steered to the S & W by the wind. At Sunrise tacked to E & N. At 5 past 6 A.M. raised a lone Sperm whale off the lee quarter by Self. Kept off for him & when we judged ourselves near enough hove too & lowered the three Boats. The whale came up to windward & the Boats gave chase. Beat to windward with the Ship. Lat Obs 5° 28' S Long 107° 40' W

Wednesday April 16th. Commenced light winds and fair weather. At 2 P.M. the Boats got up with the whale and Starboard Boat fastened. Afterwards the other Boats & got him. Beat to windward and at Sundown got the whale made fast alongside. Throughout the night & morning squally with rain. At 7 A.M. commenced cutting in the whale. At 5 P.M. took a small observation & made the Longitude 107° 56' Lat Obs 5° 17' S

Thursday April 17th. First part pleasant weather. At Sunset had the Blubber & Head on board & Case bailed & commenced boiling. Middle & Latter part squally with hard Showers of rain. No observation Steered to East. Long 109° 00'

Friday April 18th. Light winds & frequent squally of rain. At 5.30 P.M. raised 2 Sperm whales from the Main by Franklin. 5 miles off the weather Bow. Lowered for
