

Wednesday June 4th Warm pleasant weather. Starboard Boats crew ashore with liberty. Varnished the Waist both sides and painted the Starboard side. The Cooper and W. Lake setting up and fitting Pipes for water. ✕

Thursday June 5th Warm pleasant weather with fresh Sea breezes in the latter part of the day. Painted the Starboard Side. Waist Boats crew ashore with liberty.

At 4 P.M. the Boats carried some casks to the watering place and filled them. When they came off William Smith who shipped in Deyter absented himself. 

Friday June 6th Light breezes and warm pleasant weather. Crew employed getting off water. ✕

Saturday June 7th Light breezes and warm pleasant weather. Crew employed getting off water. Took on board Potatoes Yams & other vegetables & Fruit. Four men commenced doing duty on board.

Sunday June 8th Light air of wind, and hot sultry weather. Nothing but necessary duty done being the Sabbath. Starboard Boats crew ashore with liberty, also the 1st & 2^d Officers and Cooper. At Sundown all rendered themselves at the landing place and came on board except W. Quintan the Cooper. 

Monday June 9th Light winds and hot sultry weather. All hands employed getting water and storing it and bringing off Potatoes Yams & other vegetables & Fruit. Also 5 Goats & Hides & 2 Turkeys 1 Duck & a Pig.

Tuesday June 10th Warm weather and very little wind. Finished taking off water and stored off the hold. The Boats passing to & from the shore bringing off the remainder of Small Stores &c. One of the crew named James Prime deserted while on shore in the Boat. Two more men came on board and commenced doing duty.

At twilight Mr. Thearman W. Brown, the boatstewards & two of the crew went ashore in the Starboard Boat for an hour or two and at midnight had not returned. 

Wednesday June 11th 1834 Light air and calm and warm pleasant weather. At Sunrise a Boat went to the shore to see what had happened to the Starboard Boat that it did not return last night. The Boat returned bringing the crew that went in the Starboard Boat, it having been taken possession of by order from the Chief or acting Governor, for being on the beach after 8 o'clock. Captain West went ashore and obtained his release. Made preparations for going to sea. Took on board a quantity of baggage belonging to some American Missionaries who are to take passage with us to Woahoo. The men that deserted or have left the Ship viz. William Smith alias Daniel Flynn Wm. Quintan (Cooper), and James Prime have not returned. At Noon I end by civil computation and re-commenced Sea account making but 12 hours for this days Remarks.

Thursday June 12th Began light air of wind from S.W. At 1 P.M. Capt. West came on board, also Alex. W. Andrews & Lady Doctor Chapin and lady with their families & servants who are to be landed at Woahoo. Immediately after got under weigh and made sail for Woahoo Island. At 3 P.M. took the trade wind blowing a smart breeze. Double reefed Fore & Main Topsails. Stood down between Nanai & Moroto Islands. At Sunset the West part of Moroto bore N.E. & E. and Woahoo W. & about 30 miles distant. At 8 P.M. lay to with the heads yards aback. At daylight kept away for Diamond Point near the entrance of the harbor. At 8 A.M. being off the harbor lay to and set the Passengers on shore. Starboard Boat with the 2^d Officer employed transporting baggage to the shore. An English Whaler Boat came off having on board a Mr. Reynolds of Woahoo with whom the Capt. went on shore at 9 A.M. The Ship lying off & on the harbor. At noon the town and shipping bore North 2 miles distant, &
