

July 12-1834 First part strong breezes and cloudy weather. Steered to the Westward by the wind. Wind North. At night shortened Sail & were heading to Eastward. At 10 P.M. set Courses jib & Spanker. At daylight commenced bailing out the hold & stowing down Oil. Middle and Latter part strong breezes and pleasant weather with passing clouds.

Lat by Indifferent Obs 34° 35' N

Sunday July 13th First and Middle part fresh breezes and cloudy weather. At 8 P.M. got the Oil below from off deck & 88 Bbls stowed. At Daylight washed off and made all Sail to E & N by the wind. At 9 A.M. raised a number of Sperm Whales from the Main by Isaac Parker, ahead, off the weather & lee bow & weather beam. At 10 A.M. lowered the Starboard Mast & Bow Boats. Starboard Boat fastened & killed a 25 or 30 Bbl Whale and left it with a whet in it. Ends with a light air of wind and pleasant weather.

No Obs.

Monday July 14th Commences nearly calm. Starboard Boat towed and went to the other Boats supposing one of them to be stove, but returned as the Boats were still chasing the Whales. The Starboard Boat then went and brought the last Boat Whale alongside. Mast Boat fastened to a large Whale & then the Starboard & bow Boat and killed him. At Sundown got the large Whale alongside. At Daylight commenced cutting in. At 7 A.M. had the Small Whale's Head and Blubber on board and at noon had the Blubber from off the large Whale.  Lat Obs 33° 43'.

Tuesday July 15th Fair weather with passing clouds and moderate breezes. At 1 P.M. commenced taking in the Wood and getting the Case ready for bailing. At 4 P.M. had all on board. Got the Fry works under way and commenced boiling. Set the Fore Course. Headed to Eastward. Daylight set Double reefed Topsails jib & Spanker. Set up some Pipes and started Water from Casks into them. Lat Obs 33° 26' N

Wednesday July 16th Light winds and pleasant weather. Headed to Eastward under Short Sail. All hands taking care of Oil & boiling. Set up Pipes and started Water out of Casks into them. Lat Obs 33° 17' N.

Thursday July 17th Light winds and pleasant weather. At 2 P.M. down to 1 P.M. Midnight finished trying out one whale making about 90 and the other 35 Bbls. At Daylight washed off & made Sail steering N.W. All hands at work on oil and making ready for stowing it.

Lat Obs 34° 33' N

Friday July 18th Light winds and pleasant weather. Steered to the N.W. & N.W. Stowing down Oil. At 10.30 A.M. raised two Sperm Whales from the Main by self 2 points off the Starboard Bow. Did not see them only at one rising and they appeared to be going quick to windward.

Lat Obs 34° 23' N.

Saturday July 19th Light winds and pleasant weather. Steered to N.W. & N.W. At Sundown finished stowing down Oil. Daylight made all necessary Sail. At 3 A.M. tacked to S.E. by the wind. Wind Easterly. Lat Obs 35° 17' S.

Sunday July 20th Fresh breezes and pleasant weather. Steered to S.E. by the wind. At 10 A.M. raised several Sperm Whales from the Main by William Johnson. 2 points off the weather bow. At 1 past 10 A.M. lowered the fore Boat. Mast Boat fastened with two lines & both drawn. Lat Obs 34° 12' N.

Monday July 21st Fresh breezes and pleasant weather. Several scattering schools of Sperm Whales in sight bound to windward. At 2 P.M. took up the Boats. At 4 P.M. lowered Mast and Mast Boats but as they could not gain on the Whales at 6 P.M. took them up. At Sundown lowered Mast & Mast Boats for several whales ahead going to
