

14 Ship George of New Bedford, Capt. Hammond,  
Cherokee at 9 AM squared the yards &c at 11 hove aback  
at day light off the mouth of the passage, at 1 the watch  
employed, saw plenty of porpoises, middle parts squally  
from N.E. Latter parts calm. So ends this day 75 days out

Saturday August 20<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with a calm, the watch employed in  
taking care of recruits took departure from ship at 4  
P.M. Steering South, middle parts calm &c at daylight  
becalm'd, at 7 2 sail in sight, the watch employed &c  
so ends this day, 2 carcasses in sight 76 days out

Sunday August 21<sup>st</sup>  
Commences with fine weather & light breezes from N.E.  
steering South, at 6 AM spoke the Cherokee, saw another  
sail steering South, middle parts fine with light airs  
from the South, Course South, at 2 AM, fine breezes  
from N.E. at daylight 3 sail in sight, bound to  
the Southward, at 10 AM spoke the Cherokee, gam-  
ing so ends this day fine breezes from N.E. 77 days  
Lat by Obs. 36. 31 Lon. Steering S

Monday August 22<sup>d</sup>  
Commences with fine breezes from N.E. Gamming with  
Cherokee at 4 P.M. Nothing in sight, middle parts  
fine breezes from E. Latter part same Nothing in  
sight, Steering South, so ends this day 78 days  
Lat Lon

Tuesday August 23<sup>d</sup>  
Commences with fine breezes from E.N.E. Barge  
Cherokee in company the watch employed in duty  
at 4 P.M. steering S.W. Winds E.N.E. at 10 PM  
course South, middle parts fine with light squalls  
of rain, at daylight one sail in sight, two fine  
breezes from N.E. so ends this day fine weather one  
sail in sight. Lat Lon 79 days out

Wednesday August 24<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fine breezes from N.E. at 2 P.M. saw  
a spent, the watch employed &c the barge in company  
at daylight fresh breezes from N.E., at 7 AM bent the  
fore top mast staysail & repaired it &c, so ends this day  
with fine trade's Lat Lon 80 days out

15 From Western Islands Towards Pacific Ocean, 183  
Thursday August 25<sup>th</sup>

Commences with fine winds from N.E. steering to Southward  
at 2 P.M. broke out the after hatch for provisions at sunset  
the Cherokee off the lee quarter, at 7 took up fly &c  
at 11 took in maintop gallum sail, at daylight the barge  
off the lee beam middle parts fine breezes &c latter part the  
same so ends this day, nothing in sight, 81 days out  
Course South, Lat by Obs. 26. 15 Lon by Chro 24. 24

Friday August 26<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fine breezes from N.E. saw a few  
flying fish the barge off the lee beam, at 6 P.M. spoke  
her altered the course to S.E. 1/2 E. middle parts strong  
breezes from N.E. latter part same, so ends this day  
Course S by E, Lat by Obs 24. 40 Lon by Chro 22. 2

Saturday August 27<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with strong breezes from E. saw an Amer-  
ican brig steering S.W. at 8 P.M. took in main top  
gallant sail & sparker, at 1/2 past 2 AM carried  
away main top sail yard, all hands ahoy at 4 AM  
yard & sail on deck the watch below, at 7 AM the  
watch employed in fitting yard, barge Cherokee on  
weather quarter, both under double reefed top sails  
middle parts squally from East, at 12 M the  
maintop sail yard aloft so ends this day strong  
breezes, Course S by E 1/2 E, Lat by Obs 21. 31 Lon 22. 5  
83 days

Sunday August 28<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with strong breezes from E.N.E., bent  
the main top sail, spoke the barge altered  
the course to S.W. at sunset took in main top  
sail, middle parts fine breezes, at 11 AM spoke barge  
gamming so ends this day fine weather, 84 days  
Course S.W. Lat 19. 50 Lon

Monday August 29<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fine breezes steering South at  
6 P.M. parted with Cherokee at daylight barge astern  
middle parts fine weather, at daylight broke  
out main hatchway for bread & water the watch  
employed &c so ends this day 85 days out  
Lat Lon Course
