

16 Ship George of New Bedford. Whaling
Tuesday August 30th

Commences with fine breezes from N. & W. the watch employed in ships duty at 4 P.M. saw the barge lower her boats wore ship and stood for her. at dusk came up with & saw her take a whale along side. at 7 am spoke her catching a 25 barrel whale. Shook out reefs, and parted company for good now for Cape Horn. middle parts fine breezes from N. & W. so ends this day. Latter part same Course S by W. Lat Low 86 days out

Wednesday August 31st
Commences with fine breezes from N. the watch employed tarring down head stays, the barge in sight astern. Course South by West middle parts fine weather, standing under short sail at day light the barge in sight with studding sail out saw grampuses, the watch employed, so ends this day. Light winds & C Course S by W. 87 days out

Thursday September 1st
Commences with light winds and a calm the watch employed, nothing in sight, barge boiling 80 at 6 P.M. winds N. & W. middle parts light winds, at 9 am lowered for blackfish, succeeded in taking 2 to the starboard boat. at 11 2 sail in sight so ends this day, with light winds 88 days out
Course S. W. by S. Lat by Obs 13. 40. Lon

Friday Sept 2nd
Commences with light breezes from N. & W. running for a sail. at 5 P.M. spoke the barge with 2366 oil at 8 steering S. S. W. middle parts fine with light winds from N. & E. at day light the barge in company. saw black fish, the watch employed in scraping waist & C Latter parts the same. So ends 89 days out

Saturday Sept 3rd
Commences with light winds and showers from N. & E. at 2 P.M. finished scraping waist watch employed in duty the barge off the starboard beam

middle parts light variable winds, another sail in sight at daylight a ship in sight off the larboard beam standing to Southward & Eastward, at 7 commenced boiling black fish. at 9 finished. saw more black fish. varnished the larboard waist. so ends this day. Rainy 90 days out

Sunday Sept 4th 1836
Commences with light winds and showers of rain, the watch employed in varnishing starboard waist middle parts squalls of rain at day light two sail in sight saw a swallow. latter parts light winds so ends this day. Course S. S. W. Lat by Obs 11. 17. Lon 2. 17 91 days

Monday September 5th
Commences with light variable winds and rain, the barge in company. saw blackfish at 7 P.M. steering S. S. W. with moderate weather, middle parts light winds with squalls of rain at 8 P.M. steering S. S. W. with Westerly winds saw with a few flying fish & Alcores, so ends this day fine weather

Tuesday September 6th
Commences with light winds from West & pleasant weather, the bark off the lee quarter, at 4 P.M. spoke her at 7 parted company, steering S. S. W. middle parts fine breezes from N. & W. at day the barge off the weather quarter, another sail off the lee, the watch employed in rearing running rigging, latter part fine breezes from West so ends this day one sail in sight 93 days
Course S. S. W. Lat by Obs 8. 15. Lon by chro

Wednesday Sept 7th
Commences with fine breezes from W. the watch employed in duty, nothing in sight middle parts squally with rain, at day light the barge ahead. Latter parts the same so ends this day 94 days

Thursday Sept 8th
Commences with fine breezes from W. the watch employed the barge ahead. at sunset single reefed the topsails middle parts fine, at daylight made sail the Barge in company, latter parts same so ends this day 95 days
