Friday September 9th

Commences with fine weather & light winds from W. the watch employed in duty, heading to the S.E. at 6 P.M. tacked to S.W. Set a light for consort. at 2 A.M. tacked to S.E. at daylight the barque not in sight. broke out the main hatchway cooped bread, took in anchors &c so ends this day fine weather, Course S.W. 16 days out

Saturday Sept 10th

Commences with light winds, & fine pleasant weather the barque off the lee bow, at 6 spoke her captain sick middle parts fine breezes from W. latter part same saw a fin back, so ends this day fine weather

Sunday Sept 11th

Commences with fine breezes from W. in company with C. nothing in sight at 1/2 past 8 the boat came on board, steering S.E. by S. middle parts strong breezes took in Don'top gallant sail latter parts same so ends this day nothing in sight 98 days out

Monday Sept 12th

Commences with fine breezes from W.S.W. the barque in company at 4 P.M. tacked to W.S.W. middle parts fine breezes from W.S.W. at daylight ^{two} sail in sight the watch employed &c so ends this day, no fish. 99 days

Tuesday Sept 13th

Commences with Westerly winds heading to W.S.W. the watch employed, 2 sail in sight to leeward, at 5 P.M. tacked to S.E. middle parts fine, latter same nothing in sight so ends this day nothing in sight

Wednesday Sept 14th

Commences with fine breezes from Southward the watch employed in duty at 1 P.M. saw a sail on the weather bow at 4 P.M. came up with her, passed to leeward at 4 heading W. by S. middle parts light breezes from S. at

daylight sail off the Weather beam, no fish in sight, at 7 the watch employed in breaking out, after hole, at 8 raised a brace off the starboard bow, so ends this day, no whales as yet

Thursday Sept 15th

Commences with fine breezes from Southward, the watch employed in pairing chains at 5 P.M. tacked, ship heading, W. by E. a sail in sight off the starboard quarter standing to Westward middle parts fine latter parts same so ends this day, Lat 2.40 Low 14.48 102 days out

Friday Sept 16th

Commences with fine breezes from Southward, the watch employed &c heading W. by S. middle strong breezes from S. took in fly 1/2 latter parts same nothing in sight so ends this day, watch employed in fitting cutting gear, Lat Low 103 days

Saturday Sept 17th

Commences with fine southerly breezes the watch employed in fitting cutting gear, at 4 P.M. saw a sail standing to Eastward, middle parts strong breezes from S.E. heading S.W. by S. latter parts same saw a fin back, &c so ends this day 104 days out

Sunday Sept 18th Ground Equator

Commences with fine breezes from Southward & Eastward the watch employed &c at 5 P.M. saw a sail standing to Northward & Eastward, raised a fin back. middle parts clear & pleasant, at day light a sail on the Weather quarter latter parts same so ends this day, Course S.W. by W. Lat Low 105 days

Monday Sept 19th

Commences with fine weather and winds from S.E. saw nothing middle parts fine steering S.W. by W. at 7 P.M. saw black fish, the watch employed in fitting sails, so ends this day fine, Course S.W. by W. Lat by Obs Low by Chro 106 days

Tuesday Sept 20th

Commences with fine weather and winds from S.E.
