Saturday Oct 15

Commences with moderate weather at 4 p.m.
 saw a large sperm whale lowered 1 boat & or
 fast towed to boat killed & took for a long time
 at 11 P.M. set the watch, at day light commenced
 cutting, finished at 3 p.m. so ends this day a large
 whale alongside, Lat 40° 20' Low 129

Sunday Oct 16

Commences with rugged weather finished cutting, whale
 lost his head at 7 p.m. set watch commenced boiling
 at day light calm, saw fin backs latter parts rugged
 so ends this day rugged & boiling 130 days out
 Lat Low

Monday Oct 17th

Commences with rugged weather all hands employed
 in boiling &c at 6 a.m. set watch middle parts squally
 & rugged at day light cooled down cleared up ducks
 washed off &c & rugged to boil at 7 a.m. the watch below
 so ends this day bad weather heading S.E. by S. 131
 Lat Low

Tuesday Oct 18th

Commences with rugged weather the watch below noting
 in sight at 7 set the watch 3 watches middle parts moder-
 ate, at day light commenced boiling finished boiling & stow-
 ing down at 12, so ends this day good weather 132
 Lat by Obs 39° 28' Low by Obs

Commences with fine weather, all hands employed in

Commences with fine breezes from N.W. at dark took in
 main sail & top gallant sail, sent down fore top gallant & a double
 reefed the main topsail, middle parts squally at 2 p.m.
 wind N.W. at day light West. Latter parts same so ends
 this day &c Course S.W. Lat Low 135

Saturday October 22

Commences with fine breezes from N.W. squally
 with a rain, middle parts same at day light
 calm, latter parts calm with light variable winds
 so ends this day &c double reefed the topsails, 136
 Lat by Obs Low

Sunday Oct 23

Commences with fine breezes from S.W. heading S.E. under
 single reefed topsails middle parts moderate shook out reef
 from fore & main topsails set top gallant sail at day light
 cloudy with light winds from N.W. so ends this day
 steering S.W. Lat by Obs Low 137

Monday Oct 24

Commences with fine breezes from N.W. saw
 right whales & middle parts fine & pleasant
 at day light steering S.W. latter same going
 it with fore topmast steering sail out so ends
 this day fine Course S.W. by S Lat 40° Low 138

Tuesday Oct 25

Commences with fine breezes from N.W. the watch
 employed on duty saw right whales middle parts
 fine & pleasant at day light saw right whales
 latter parts same so ends this day Course S.W. by S
 Lat by Obs Low
