

36 Ship George of New Bedford Whaling
Commenced Tuesday Dec 27th

Commenced with fine weather, all hands employed in stowing down at 4 PM finished washed off middle parts fine at 7 Commenced painting boats so ends this day Lat Lon 202

Wednesday Dec 28
Commenced with fine weather painting boats at 4 PM standing for the land, raked hung back at sunset wore ship middle parts good weather at day light washed off the watch employed in fitting overhead boats so ends this day Lat 15 29 Lon 203

Thursday Dec 29
Commenced with fine weather the watch employed, fitted 1st martingale, try works nothing in sight middle parts fine at daylight put the overhead boats on the even the watch below so ends this day fine weather Lat by Obs Lon 204

Friday Dec 30th
Commenced with fine weather nothing in sight middle parts fine & clear at daylight wore ship for the land, saw a sail steering for the land so ends this day nothing in sight but porpoises Lat by Obs Lon 205

Saturday Dec 31st
Commenced with fine weather the watch employed in duty, middle same steering for the land under short sail at daylight wore off shore the watch employed so ends this day fine Lat Lon 206

Sunday January 1st 1837
Commenced with fine weather the watch employed saw breaches at sunset took in top gallant sails wore off shore steering N.W. by W. Middle parts fine at daylight cleared void the gear nothing in sight latter parts fine so ends this day Lat Lon 207

Pacific Ocean Lat 13 42 South Lon 35
Monday Jan 2d 1837

Commenced with fine weather at 4 PM lowered for blackfish middle parts calm at daylight raised a sail, latter parts fine saw fin backs & grampuses so ends this day Lat 13 41 Lon 208

Tuesday Jan 3d
Commenced with fine weather the watch employed in ships duty, middle parts fine at daylight saw the land, & a barque standing to the Northward so ends this day fine nothing in sight, Lat 209

Wednesday Jan 4th
Commenced with fine weather the watch employed in ships duty, nothing in sight at 4 PM wore ship off shore steering N.W. Middle parts fine at daylight saw a brig standing for the land so ends this day with fine weather Lat 210

Thursday Jan 5th
Commenced with fine weather saw whales sulphur bottoms intervening at 8 PM middle parts clear with fine southerly trades, at daylight nothing in sight, latter parts fine saw fin backs & grampuses so ends this day Lat Lon 211

Friday Jan 6th
Commenced with fine weather the watch employed in ships duty, middle parts fine at daylight nothing in sight latter parts fine pleasant weather nothing in sight these 24 hours so ends this day spoke ship Mobile of New Bedford 4 months out 40 lbs steering N. Lat by Obs 11 29 Lon 83 212

Saturday Jan 7th
Commenced with pleasant weather saw blackfish lowered & fastened to the quarter boat, starboard boat anchored, & Larboard boat parted middle parts fine & calm at 7 PM saw blackfish, & a large brace so ends this day Lat by Obs 213

Sunday Jan 8th
Commenced with fine weather nothing in sight but birds & ship sails middle parts fine at day nothing in sight latter parts fine so ends Lat 10 8 S
