Saturday Jan 21st

Commences with fine weather nothing in sight steering N 88 W middle parts fine & pleasant at daylight nothing in sight latter parts same so ends this day Lat by Obs 6.33 Long 228  
Sunday Jan 22nd

Commences with fine weather the watch below middle parts fine at daylight commenced stowing down in after hatchway so ends this day fine weather nothing in sight steering N 88 W Lat by Obs 5.26  
Monday Jan 23rd 229

Commences with pleasant weather & light winds the watch below middle parts fine at daylight commenced stowing down after hatch &c so ends this day Lat 2.00  
Tuesday Jan 24th 230

Commences with fine weather all hands employed stowing down at 5 PM finished washed off &c middle parts fine & clear close hauled at daylight squared yards got anchors on the bows so ends this day nothing in sight Lat by Obs 1.80  
Wednesday Jan 25th 231

Commences with fine weather made Chatham Island range for it middle parts fine low abed at daylight squared yards for the land so ends this day fine weather  
Thursday Jan 26th 232

Commences with fine weather sent 2 boats ashore turpining came on board at 5 PM with 39 turpin tacked off shore at daylight 2 boats ashore employed in turpining so ends this day  
Friday Jan 27th 233

Commences with fine weather came on board with one boat load went ashore and at 11 PM

41 Off Gallapagos Islands Jan 1837  
Arrived on board with 2 boat loads middle parts fine at 10 AM sent one boat ashore so ends this day 234

Saturday Jan 28  
Commences with fine weather and light winds boat came on board with 14 turpin braced the yards steering S.W. Chatham, Floods, & Boringtons & Hayes in sight middle parts fine at daylight Charles, Chatham & the north & Boring's Islands in sight so ends this day fine  
Sunday Jan 29th 235

Commences with fine weather & calms no whale was yet steering for Charles Island middle parts rained at daylight tacked for the land at 10 AM raised a school of whales lowered & fastened to the waist boat killed & took him along side at 12 M so ends this day. The mark in sight  
Monday Jan 30th 236

Commences with fine weather & light winds commenced cutting with pendant forward the the yard at 5 finished set the watch, quarter watches, middle parts fine & clear, at daylight cleared away head & commenced boiling, latter parts moderate so ends this day Lat 1.9  
Tuesday Jan 31st 237

Commences with fine weather & calms boiling at 6 PM set the watch at 11 finished boiling middle parts fine with light showers of rain at daylight washed off decks, broke out between decks & stowed off so ends this day Land in sight  
Wednesday February 1st 238

Commences with calms the watch employed middle parts light winds & calms at 7 AM unbet the main top sail, repaired clew sent him so ends this day fine & pleasant Lat by Obs 239  
Thursday Feb 2nd

Commences with fine weather nothing in sight middle parts dead calm at 7 the watch employed in cleaning & filling butt latter parts fine weather so ends this day nothing in sight 240
