people in latter parts fine so ends this day.

Sunday March 26th
Commences with light breeze from E.S.E. at 1 P.M.
raised a school of whales, lowered & chased until
4 P.M. killed and took him alongside at dusk took
in sail middle parts fine at day light commenced
cutting at 7, finished made sail, cleared away
head so ends this day. Lat by Obs 14° 23' Low by Obs

Monday March 27th
Commences with light winds and pleasant weather
all hands employed, at 4 P.M. made Prime of Wales
Island at dusk wore ship & double reefed the
topsails at 3 P.M. commenced boiling at daylight
made sail, at 7 made the land, so ends this
day nothing in sight. Lat by Obs 15° 04' Low 14° 12' Course S.W.

Tuesday March 28th
Commences with fine weather land in sight
boiling, at 2 P.M. finished nothing but land in
sight at sunset the land bearing N.W. distant
12 miles, middle parts fine, with light winds at
3 P.M. raised a bamboo tree. Latter parts fine
nothing in sight so ends this day. Course S.W.

Commences with light winds & pleasant weather the
watch employed cooping on at 4 P.M.
middle parts fine took in sails & fly
at day light at them islands of
Olakite & some running it bent the
cables, so ends this day.

Thursday 30th
Commences with fine breeze, at 2 P.M. came
to an anchor, in Matavia Bay, at day light
heeled the ship, and repaired the copper, at
so ends this day.

Friday 31st
Finished repairing copper at 3 P.M. righted
ship at day light hauled ashore ships Canton
Addison, Aberick Dartmouth of New Bedford
for, Spartan Baltic Baralay of Antwerp
lying in port so ends.

Saturday April 1st
Fine pleasant weather the watch ashore
stowed down water and blashed the bends
at day light the watch ashore, so ends this
day.

Sunday April 2nd
Commences with fine pleasant weather the
watch ashore nothing to do so ends & C.

Monday April 3rd
the watch employed in getting off water &
stowing it the rest ashore raising the Devil.

Tuesday April 4th
Fine pleasant weather the watch ashore
the rest employed stowing water & tarring
head stays so ends this day.

Wednesday April 5th
the watch ashore the rest employed in duty
lashed ships Canton & Dartmouth so ends

Thursday April 6th
the watch ashore washed ship & got ready
