spent in trying and in filling  
up and storing water for  
the passage home Lat 50 Miles S

and pleasant weather at 6 A.M.  
tacked ship and stood to the south  
ward and at 3 P.M. finished  
trying out the 4 whales saw  
a plenty of Black fish and  
porpoises Lat 37 Miles south

These 24 hours Light winds  
and pleasant weather at 4  
A.M. raised whales but did  
not lower as they were a going  
to windward at 12 Meridian  
tacked ship and stood to the  
Northward Lat 1° 24 south

1824  
These 24 hours Strong trade  
pleasant weather at 5 A.M. called  
all hands and washed off the  
Decks and at 4 began breaking  
out the main hold between  
Decks at 1 P.M. began storing  
down oil Lat 56 Miles south

1824  
These 24 hours Strong trade and  
clear pleasant weather at 6 A.M.  
saw a breach from Mast head  
at 2 P.M. finished storing down  
and the Decks off washed off  
at 6 P.M. tacked ship and  
stood to the southward Lat 5° 15 S

The first part of these 24 hours  
Light winds and pleasant weather  
at 5 A.M. called all hands and  
washed off the Decks at 4 began  
wetting the hold the afternoon Light  
winds and squally weather with  
showers of rain Lat 25 Miles south

The first part of these 24 hours Strong  
trade and cloudy weather at 2 A.M.  
saw 2 whales from Mast head and  
tacked ship for them at 10 lowered  
and chased until 12 and got none  
the afternoon Light winds and clear
