Clear pleasant weather
the watch employed in Drawing
and knotting yarns and in
making spun yarn. Lat 34° 00'

day
March
5
1824
The first part of these 24 hours
starry wind and pleasant
weather at 9 A.M. a squall
of wind attended with a
whirl wind that we very
narrowly escaped at 10 saw the
Island of Manafuene bearing
E & E distant 12 Leagues
the after part more squally
the watch employed in making
spun yarn. Lat 33° 51' South

Satur
day
March
6
1824
There 24 hours stiff breezes and
cloudy weather at 5 A.M. squared
away and ran down to the Island
of Manafuene and our boats went
on shore and at 11 came on board
again having caught a few fish
at 1 they returned and got 100
More

Sun
day
March
7
1824
This Day squally and squally the
Ship under Double reefed top sails
at 7 A.M. 3 Boats went on shore
and got 5 Loads of wood and
5 boats at 2 P.M. got all on
board and shaped our Course for
the Island of Juan Fernandez the
rest of the Day spent in Cutting
and stowing away the wood &c

Mon
day
March
8
1824
The first part of these 24 hours
stiff breezes and squally weather
the middle part more pleasant
at 8 A.M. shook out the reefs and set the
top gallants Sails the after part
squally at 6 P.M. the East end
of Juan Fernandez bore S & E distant
3 or 4 Leagues

Tues
day
March
9
1824
There 24 hours Light winds and
cloudy weather at 7 A.M. 2 Boats
went on shore and at 2 P.M.
returned Laden with Peaches
and went back again and got
some more in all 15 Barrels

Wed
day
March
10
1824
There 24 hours Light winds and
pleasant weather at 8 A.M.
the East end of Juan Fernandez
bore west North west distant
10 Leagues
