Clear pleasant weather at 8 A.M.
Squared the yards and stood in for
the land at 5 P.M. took in the
fore and Mizzen top sails and
hauled on the wind off shore
Lat 35° 15' South

Mon day
April
the
5.
1824
The first part of these 24 hours a
faint Breeze from the S.W.
the afterpart a Gale of wind
from the South at 8 A.M. wore
ship and stood in shore at 4 P.M.
took in sail for the night Lat 34° 40'

Tues day
April
the
6.
1824
The first of these 24 hours a stiff
Breeze from the S.E. the afterpart
a Gale of wind

7.
1824
These 24 hours a Gale
of wind from the South
Lat 34° 18' South

Thurs day
April
the
8.
1824
These 24 of Gale of wind
from the S.W. the ship
laying too under close reef main
top sails and stay sail Lat 33° 58'

9.
1824
The first Part of these 24 hours
a Gale of wind from the S.E.
the middle part more pleasant
at 8 A.M. set fore sail fore top
sail and Mizzen top sail the
afterpart Light winds at 6 P.M.
wore ship and took in sail
Lat 33° 46' South

Satur day
April
the
10.
1824
These 24 hours Commenced with Light
winds and pleasant weather at 1 A.M.
wore ship the afterpart Clear and
pleasant with a strong breeze from
the Southward the watch employed
in breaking out water and in
wetting the hold at 5 P.M. wore
ship being close in with the land
Lat 33° 52' South

Sun day
April

11.
1824
The first part of these 24 hours a
fresh Breeze from the S.E. the
middle part a Gale of wind from the
Southward at 6 A.M. close reefed
the main top sail and took in the
fore sail the afterpart a Gale of
wind 3 watches below Lat 33° 51'

Mon day
April
the
12.
1824
These 24 hours a Gale of wind from
the S.E. at 6 A.M. wore ship head
to the Eastward and the wind abated
a little set the fore sail and at 5 P.M.
the wind increased took it in again
Lat 33° 37'
