Clear and Calm at 1 P.M. Saw
a Sail on the Starboard bow appar-
ently standing in towards the Land
Lat by observation 33° 31 South

1824
The first part of these 24 hours Commences
with calm clear weather the
middle part a light Breeze from the
N.N.W. with thick cloudy weather
the afterpart Clear with a light
Breeze at 5 P.M. saw a large
Shoal of Sperm whales and lowered
the boats but got none. Lat 33° 25

16
1824
These 24 hours Clear calm weather
at 8 A.M. saw a Shoal of black
fish and lowered the boats and got
four the rest of the day spent
in cutting them in and trying them
out they made 5 barrels of oil
Lat 33° 03 South

17
1824
The first part of these 24 hours Light
winds from the S.S.W. the
afterpart a gale of wind from the
same quarter with cloudy squally
weather at 12 Meridian took in
the Fore and Mizzen top sails and at
2 P.M. took in the Fore sail
Lat 33° 26 South

Sun
day
the
18
of
April
1824
These 24 hours Commences with a gale
of wind from the S.E. the middle
part more moderate with cloudy
weather at 5 P.M. set the Fore
sail and Mizzen top sail and Fore top
sail at 10 A.M. spoke the ~~the~~ Ship
Royal George of London Capt.
* 3 Months out no oil.

19
1824
These 24 hours Commences with light
winds and clear weather the middle
part strong winds and cloudy
weather Double reefed the top sails
Fore and aft the afterpart a gale
of wind from the S.W. with cloudy
squally weather 11 A.M. took in
the Fore and Mizzen top sails and
at 4 P.M. the gale increased took
in the Fore sail the Capt of the
Royal George spent the day on
Board of us Lat 34° 24 South
