These 24 hours Light winds and Clear weather the watch employed in Breaking out water and wetting the hold at 9 A.M. Saw a Sail on the weather quarter at 12 Meridian tacked Ship and stood for her and at 2 P.M. spoke her. She proved to be the Factor of Nantucket Capt. Maxfield 4 months out with oil from her we heard the price of oil was 40 cents per gallon in December 1823 to us as very pleasant. near Lat 32° 51'

The first part of these 24 hours Light winds from the W.N.W. at 4 P.M. the wind shifted suddenly to the S.E. the after- part Strong winds and wet rainy weather at 3 P.M. Saw a large whale on the weather beam and lowered 3 Boats and chased until sunset but could not catch him Lat 31° 29' South

These 24 hours Light winds and Cloudy weather at 12 P.M. tacked Ship head to the Eastward the wind from the S.E. the whole 24 hours at 5 P.M. Saw the Land bearing from the S.E. to East distant 5 leagues Lat 30° 49' South Long 71° west

These 24 hours Light wind and Clear pleasant weather at 4 P.M. set the top gallants sails and stood in to the Land and at 3 P.M. came to anchor in the Bay of Coquimbos On Lat 29° 56' and Lon 71° 19' west where was a ship and a brig one and American ship and the others ~~Patriots~~ Patriots

These 24 hours Clear and pleasant with a Light breeze from 10 A.M. to 6 P.M. the other part of the time Calm this morning the Patriot ship left this port and in the afternoon came in 3 Ships the Paladium of Boston and Percheron of Falmouth whalersmen and the Stanmore under English Colours a ship that was taken some months ^{ago} by a Chilese Privateer or Pirate from which she made her escape she had in when taken 400,000 Dollars in specie. This day all hands employed in fitting rigging our Boat on Shore several times in the course of the Day &c
