

Friday June 24th 1852

Got under way and started out and come
To anchor of the 9 miles rock and board away
The waist boat and fuled the old man ashore
To stop with the old woman one more night ^{shore}
And he come aboard the next morning and
Stood off at sea with a fair wind and plenty
Of it from S ^W bearing S S E

Long 69 = 06

Saturday the 25th 1852

This day commences with a strong S S W
Wind steering S S E the later part of the day saw
Porpoises Men employed in setting up fore and main
Top mast and topgallant backstays spoke an English
Hermaphrodite Brig bound E some of our greasy hand
Hond has got over being seasick altho some are
Fretting to be set ashore specly Thomas Mayew when
Is seasick and sick of the sea

Sunday June 26th

This day commences with light winds from the
S ^W heading Eastward winds saw several sails at
1/2 past 6 Am reefed the foretopsil after taking in
Our light sails the ends with wind and rain
Long = 02 ^W

Monday June 28th 1852

Commences with squalls of wind and rain
With the sport of reefing the main topsil the
Later part of the day squally and raining close
Reefed the main topsill and fuled the foretopsil
And laid under close reefed main topsail
Fore topmast stay sail and main spencer the
Weather being moderate as the Day to be color
Lat 35 = 44 Long 60 = 05 ^W

Tuesday June 29th 1852

Commences with moderate gales from the S ^W
In the corse of the Day got sail on her and
At sunset the wether quite moderated and
Continued se the same the Day

Lat 36 = 35 ^N Long 60 = 05 ^W

June 30th 1852

This Day commences with light breezes from the
S S ^W steering S E saw one sail

Lat 38 = 11 Long 57 = 38 ^W

July 1852

This Day commences with light westerly wind steering
S E & saw 2 sails and Black fish Cowfish and Porpoises
Long 53, 58 ^W
