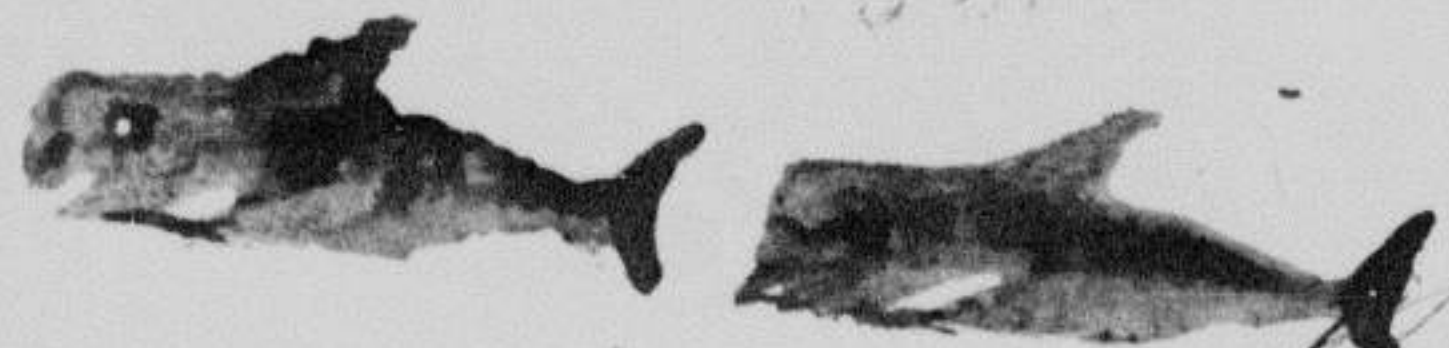


July 2nd 1852

Lat 32-53 Long 53-53 W

July 3rd 1852

This Day commences with light northerly
Breaves at 6 Am lowered away thir Boats and
Took 2 Blackfish on to the Harbor Boat and one
To the waist Boat and histing them in on deck
And strip fat them the latter part of the Day nearly
Calm Lat 32-36 Long 54-46 W



July 4th 1852

Commences with light breezes ^{no}
Particular direction the later part nearly calm men
Employed in booting out on Blackfish the day ends well

July 5th 1852 Commences with light breezes
Continues so throughout the day steering S E at
Sunset shorting sail and commenced standing Boats
Arries watches Long 52-07 Lat 52-59 W

July 6th 1852 Commences with light northerly
Breaves steering S E saw several sail and run for
But darkness coming on we gave it up of a bad
Job Lat 37-40 W

July 7th 1852

This day commences
With light breezes from no particular direction
Steering E Lat 32-29 Long 51-56 W
Thursday July the 8th 1852

This day commences with light breezes from the N
Shore Barque Willis of mattsport Cap Briggs
2 months out 55 lbs sperm also the ~~Wasp~~ ^{Wasp} out
The Fox of Waspport 14 months out 410 Sperm W
Thursday the day breave increased Lat 32-32 Long 50-24

July 9th 1852 This day commences with a
Strong wind from North saw Blackfish and one
Sail supposed to be the garland of New Bedford
King Lat 31-32 N Long 50-24

July 10th 1852

Commences with strong breezes from the North our
master secured men setting up fore rigging the
Day end with strong breezes Lat 31-16 Long 50-35

Sunday the 11th 1852 The wether more
Moderate at sunses mad sail with a light breave
Steering W by the wind Lat 31-15

July Monday the 12th 1852 Commences
With light wind from the N at 3 Am spoke the Fox
Fox of Waspport spome 410 sperm the later of the Day
Moderate Lat 30-05 N Long 50-43
