Breeze from the Westward steering by the wind at
10 clock PM went on board the Mattapoisett and staid
till 2 clock and went on board the Barque Elsiebeth
Captain Cole and the Barque I Franklin Gifford and
Got some letters from home the day ends well with a
Fine breeze from the eastward steering S Lat 32° 35' N
Long 71° 13' W

August the 1 1852 Sunday This month
commences with light winds and peruse saw several
sails had a light squall of rain and wind the men
employed in setting up topmast rigging the
Day ended with a strong breeze at 11 o'clock
the fore topsail Lat

Monday the 2 This day beginning a strong
Breeze from the S E W steering by the wind the day ends
with a strong breeze from the southward

Tuesday the 3 1852 This day commences
with a strong breeze from the Eastward steering
By the wind men employed in ships duty
Lat 31° 49' Long 49° 44' W

Wednesday the 4 1852 Commences with
strong breeze from the eastward steering by the wind
Under single reefed topsails at 7 clock PM raised
White water vapor saw it again
men employed in the turning in the fore rigging
The day ends with light breeze S E steering by the wind
Lat 39° 08' N Long 49° 39' W

Thursday the 5 This day commences with a
Light wind from the S E steering by the wind
Men employed in setting up rigging the day
ends with a light breeze from the eastward

Friday the 6 1852 Commences with a
Light breeze from the S E steering by the wind the men
employed in rotting down the fore rigging
at 4 PM saw grasshoppers one sail in sight
Lat 31° 32' Long 49° 39'

Saturday 7 1852
commences with a strong breeze from the Eastward
steering by the wind with the starboard tacks
leading N E the men employed in rotting
down the fore rigging saw seven sails
Lat 31° 40' N Long 49° 20' W
