

August the 8 1852

This day commences with a good breeze
from the Eastward steering by the wind spoke
the Bark Maffagoras of Newport ^{WV} and the
Franklin Gifford the day ends well
Lat 32° 4' N

Monday the 9 1852

This day commences with a good wind from
the S E steering to the eastward men
employed setting up fore topsail rigging at 4
PM saw schooner ^{WV} that lowered away the
Earl of boat he had been chased all day with.
The Schooner ^{WV} ~~Alford~~ ^{Alford} galed the day end
with a light breeze from the S E
Heading S E Lat 31° 19' N Long 48° 10' W

Tuesday the 10 1852

This day commences with a light breeze
from the S E full and by saw Grampascas
and Blackfish at 6 AM squared
the main yards and steered to the Northward
Lat 35° 57' N Long 46° 48' 2" W

August 11 1852

With a light breeze from the S steering
to the Northward saw sail 3 PM
Broke out for molasses to the in sail at sunset
The day ends with light breeze S E steering
to the northward Lat 34° 49' N Long 47° 41' W

Thursday 12 with a light breeze
from the Southward steering to the Northward
Men employed braking out the main hole.
For Tea & Coffee at 8 PM squared in the
yards and steered S E with a good breeze
Lat 35° 24' N Long 46° 27' W

Friday 13 commences with a light
breeze from the S W steering to the
Eastward saw a sail the day ends with
A strong breeze from the W heading eastward
Lat 34° 50' N Long 45° 20' W

Saturday 14 1852 A strong breeze
from the N W steering to the Eastward
11 PM Spoke the Macator Noncomber
9 hrs bound home the day ends with a light breeze
Lat 34° 34'
