

WEDNESDAY the 15<sup>th</sup> 1852  
the day commences with a light breeze from  
the Eastward steering to the Northward  
nothing special occurred the day ends with  
a light breeze Lat 34° 42' N Long 45° 39' W

THURSDAY the 16<sup>th</sup> 1852  
This day commences with a light breeze from  
the Eastward steering by the wind to the Northward  
At 3 PM off the Ganctee Nickerson had seen  
Whales & saw the Mattapoisett of the port  
San Whales 8 times got 40 lbs men employed  
Setting the main rigging 2 sails in sight good  
breeze from the Eastward  
Lat 35° 47' Long 35° 45' W

FRIDAY the 17<sup>th</sup> 1852 strong breeze from  
the N.E. steering by the wind one sail set men  
employed in ships duty the day ends with a strong  
breeze from N.E. Lat 35° 54' Long 43° 33' W

MONDAY the 18<sup>th</sup> 1852 a good breeze from N.E.  
steering to the Eastward at 4 PM and sail till 10 o'clock  
Squared the yards and steared S.E. at 8 PM raised  
Whales the starboard bow at 4 PM board away 2 boats  
And 3 hours ride to the windward got close to him he  
went down Lat 30° 13' S 43° 30'

WEDNESDAY the 19<sup>th</sup> 1852 This day commences  
Chasing whales at 3 PM come on board and got  
our dinners at 4 PM loared away 2 boats and chased  
till 4 PM with the good luck no whales & sail  
Night day end with bad luck  
Lat 34° 57' N Long 42° 28' W

FRIDAY the 20<sup>th</sup> commences with a good breeze  
from the N.W. steering to the Eastward at 8  
PM saw killer at PM saw carcass of a sperm  
Whale sea grampuses men employed in ships  
Duty the day ends with a light breeze from the  
N.E. steering & Lat 38° 45' Long 41° 38'

WEDNESDAY the 21<sup>st</sup> with a light wind from  
the N.E. steering & men employed in ships  
Duty the day ends with a light breeze  
Lat 38° 08' N Long 40° 49' W

THURSDAY the 22<sup>nd</sup> This day  
commences with a light breeze from N.E.  
steering by the wind men employed in  
ships duty the day ends with a light breeze  
Lat 35° 07' Long 39° 46' W
