

August 1852 Monday 30

This day commences with a strong breeze from the NE heading ESE saw grampuses and porpoises and cowfish and sails and boiled out our fish which made us 3 bbs of oil Lat 36-19 Long 36-30

August ~~30~~ Tuesday 31 1852
This day commences with a light wind from the NW steering by the wind saw one sail Porpoises cowfish the day ends with a light breeze

Lat 35-38 Long 35-09

September 1 1852
This month commences with a strong wind from the NW steering ESE the men employed in shifting the pig iron in the run forward to the bulk head this day ends with a strong breeze and a heavy ground swell

Lat 36-11 Long 33-46

Wednesday 2 1852

This day commences with a strong breeze from the NW steering by the wind saw porpoises
This day ends with a light breeze
Saw Porpoises

Lat 37-11 Long 34-47

September the 3 1852 Friday
Commences with a strong breeze from the NW steering ESE at 10 AM saw land of the Westward Island the day ends with a strong breeze Lat 37-34 Long 31-23

Saturday the 4 1852
This day commences with a strong breeze at 6 PM I reefed fore and main topsail and hove to of the St. Florus and laid all night Lat 37-34 Long 30-34 Flores Curacao

Sunday the 5 1852
This day commences with a gale of wind saw several sails at 8 PM close reefed the fore and main topsails the day ends with heavy gale of wind and rain

Monday the 6 1852 this day commences with heavy gale of wind and rain at 6 PM Took in the foresail and closed reefed the main topsail and hove to on the larboard tack standing off from the land the wind moderated towards morning so that at 6 PM we took the reefs out of the topsails and hauled in sail the day ends with light wind
