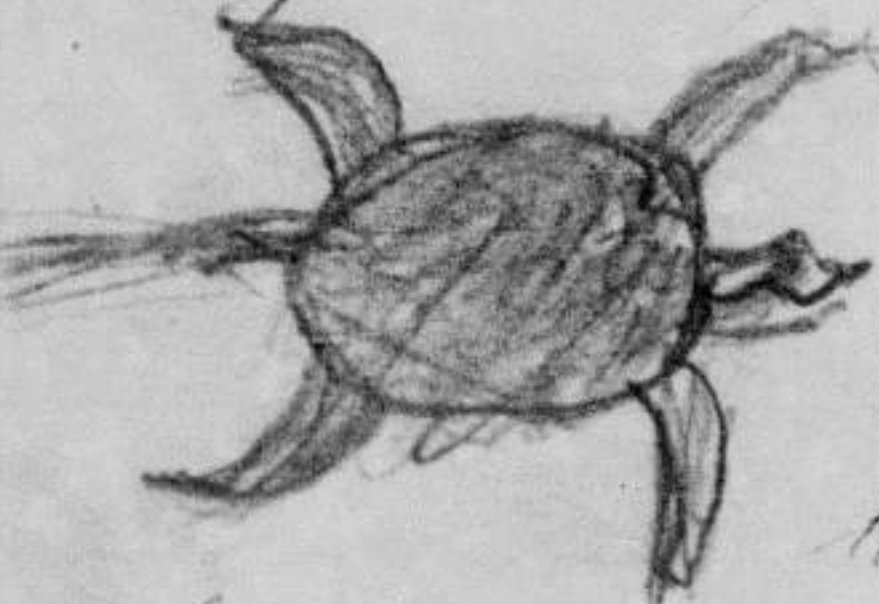

Saturday the 2^d this day commences with light winds from the S.E. bearing Southerly with several sails in sight caught a Loggerhead Turtle saw Blackbirds Cowfish Porpoises and Killers



Sunday the 3^d commences with light winds at 8 A.M.

lowered a boat to go on shore to trade for fruit and Hogs but on going near the shore we saw several Portuguese who told us that the trade was forbid on our landing on that part of the Island except at the town by a present from the Governor so we came on board and beat up to the town and went on shore where we left the captain and went back of the bill of health and then went on shore again in the afternoon.

October 1852 Monday commences as I started yesterday had on horse run on shore with them the Captain for the night it being fast day with them yesterday we could not trade except a very little we got about 20 oranges a few times and one bunch of Bananas At 7 P.M. the next morning sent a bag of bread & portaid also a lot of calico The ship Bondick of Warren is now going off and now with us and has got a boat on shore with her left here 2 or 3 days ago saw Robinson of Fairhaven which we saw to about the day ends with good weather lying off and on at Bravo.

Tuesday the 5th commences with light breeze At 4 P.M. our boat came off bringing 8 hogs a lot of fowls Pumpkin Bananas and oranges and fetch 2 Portuguese their names the former one left the samuel Robinson spoke the Bondick and got some papers and then squared the yards for the North the day ends with light winds saw 3 sails and Broke out for Walter and Lat 13° 39' N Long 51° 00' W Corar Coffee Thomas Cambie left in Bravo he went by the name of mercy
