

October 1852, Wednesday commences with light breeze saw several sails Porpoises Blackfish and Albicor the day ends with light S E trade winds steering South 11° 55' Long 41° 55'

Thursday the 7 This day commences with light Breeze attending with rain Thunder and lightning saw several sails and several schools of Blackfish the day ends with light breeze Broke out for Day 11° 10'

Friday the 8 commences with light and variable wind attended with rain saw several sails one of which was a Whaler the day ends with a light wind Lat 24° 40' N

Saturday the 9 This day passes as several of the preceding saw Porpoises and a Penback and several sails this day ~~ends~~ passes away with very light wind

Lat 19° 49' N Long 24° 29'

Sunday the 10 This day commences saw several schools Porpoises and sails had storm of rain steering S W main

Lat 11° 23' N Long 44'

October 1852, Monday

This day commences with wind and rain heading S E by the wind saw Blackfish and several Porpoises and saw 2 sails one of which we signalled a Dutch Galleon running by the Bremen flag the day ends with moderate weather Lat 21° 21' N Long 24° 24'

Tuesday the 12 commences with light S W winds up from gradually near to the N as the day nears away to 6 P M sails fireclipsy stunsill steering S E W saw Blackfish and a sail Leeward away the waist boat for Blackfish but got none Lat 21° 44' N Long 21° 44'

Wednesday the 13 This day commences with light and variable winds saw Grampises and Blackfish and a sail heading. Latterly the latter part of the day very fine

Lat 21° 13' N Long 21° 13'

Thursday the 14 commences S W wind attending with squalls of wind and rain saw a school of Grampises

Lat 20° 55' N Long 20° 55'
