 in fishing for *Albicores*
 and *higles* caught 4 saw
 1 killer. The mate landed
 one and sent him to spitting
 blood at 6 AM. At the fore
 28 top sail also reefed the day
 ended with a heavy gale of
 wind Lat Long

Est 28 S E Tuesday the 30th with a heavy gale
 it moderated down so that we
 set the foresail and wore
 ship saw a turtle it moderated.
 Down towards morning and
 loosed all sail saw several sail
 broke out for water the day
 ended with a light breeze
 Lat Long

Course wind December 22 Wednesday
 N E E common sea with a light breeze
 saw several sail spoke the
 Bark Manchester of salame
 2 month out Bound for
 Buenos Ayres got some Papers
 and food

Lat Long
 Thursday 23
 came with a strong breeze saw one
 sail at 12 M. Tacked ship saw
 4 or 5 sails out of the main topsail
 backstays take in the fly jib a gaff
 topsails and main gaff sail
 2 reefs in the fore topsails and
 and main topsails this day end
 with a strong breeze
 Lat Long

Friday 24 with a strong
 breeze foggy weather at 12 M
 Tacked ship men employed
 in ship haul saw one
 sail caught ~~two~~ ashore
 the day ends with a strong breeze
 Lat Long
