

Monday June 6th 1853

Moderate breeze through the day saw nothing

Tuesday the 7th Light breeze men employed in repairing the main spence and foretopmast staysail spoke the Resident and saw the Carver and Grayhound the latter part of the day

Wednesday the 8th strong breeze split the jib and wanted mizzenle sheeted it saw the Governor, Carver, Greyhound and Maltby and Garland but did not speak the

Thursday the 9th spoke the Greyhound Governor and ran down into the passage off Pape sent a boat on shore and got 2 Portagues.

Friday the 10th Boat still on shore at 5 PM boat come on board bringing half a Bullock some oxen sheep and another man in the place of the one we directed by the name of John France

Saturday June 11th 1853

Light wind sent down and repaired the main topsail Finbacks Portraits and jammers Lat 30.32 Long 73.02

Sunday the 12th light breeze and fine weather saw nothing Lat 26.16 Long 77

Monday the 13th At 1 PM Looked out a boat and took 2 spars along side one topmast and yard belonging to some wreck took of the bands and let the topmast go took in the yard which we got about 110. of iron ^{chain} 9 feet long saw several sails and Grandfines Lat 26.14 Long 77.55

Tuesday the 14th

Light winds saw Grandfines and Portraits hoard about for Grandfines thinking it a dead Whale and one spar and a fin Lat 26.14 Long 77.55
