Saturday the 25 a good wind through
the day saw nothing

Sunday the 26 commences with good
winds the latter part of the day
pleasant Lat 35° 50' N Long 42° 25'

Monday the 27 fine weather through
the day saw Porpoises

Tuesday 28 light wind through the
day saw one seal Lat 35° 32' N Long 43° 19'

Wednesday 29 more moderate saw schools
N.W. & E. of Grampian
Lat 35° 26' N Long 43° 38'

Thursday 30 Quite moderate at 6 PM
EST spoke the Bark Kattelen Capt
Allen of New Bedford 13 mounds out
300 sperm 300 whale no oil on
board the day ends with a strong breeze
Lat 35° 10' N Long 42° 58' W

Friday July the 1st 1853
EST NE strong through the day saw
the Kattelen with her main yard
back and immediately hauled up for
her being to the windward we thought
she was a whaling we soon found out
by her keeping off for to spoke her
Lat 42° P.M. we had found that she
had lost a man Native of Warhoo had
been sick a long time and threatened
to drown him by jumping overboard
of the head rail and before he could
get a ~~board~~ down he went down
Lat 35° 19' Long 44° 44'

Saturday 2
N.E. S.W. Light wind through the day
the Kattelen in sight at sunset
luffed to the wind
Lat 35° 50' N Long 41° 23'

Sunday the 3rd
Moderate breeze to day saw the
saw the Kattelen and Porpoises
Lat 36° 59' N Long 42° 29'
