Friday the 15th

NE Light wind through the day saw several sail pick up a small spar and caught a  herd Blackfish spouting during the night Broke out for water

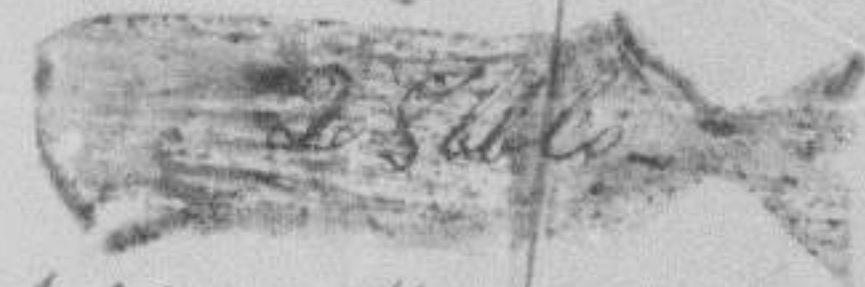
Lat 36° 40' Long 42° 06'

Saturday the 16th

Comences with fine weather saw many quantity of sail Lat 36° 39' Long 42° 35'

Sunday the 17th Comences with light breeze SE at 2 PM saw a ship a Whaling at 5 PM saw sperm Whales at 6 PM board my boat did not get first came on board at 8 PM at 7 PM with the same same schooner at 10 AM board the boat and one got fast and soon killed him ~~and~~ him along side Lat 36° 59' Long

Lat 37° 03' Long 43° 12'

Wednesday the 20th

E light breeze through the day men complained in stoving down our oil in the after hole on the ~~floor~~ Lat 36° 50' Long 43° 16'

Thursday 21st

various E very light wind to day fine weather saw Grampuses and Porpoises Killers and squid Lat 36° 56' Long 43° 16'

Friday 22nd very calm

SE E PM toward for Blackfish but got none saw several   the day ends well
