Wednesday the 27th of July 1853

light wind and fine weather saw
gramphouses and blackfish
Lat 35° 09' Long 43° 58'

Thursday the 28th

light wind saw porpoises and
gramphouses and Blackfish
Lat 34° 33' Long 44° 43'

Friday the 29th verably winds through the

day saw Porpoises jumpers saw
one sail broke out for rice
apples and pork Lat 34° 50' Long 45° 51'

Saturday the 30th

light winds and fine weather saw
Porpoises and jumpers one sail
men employed painting the barboard
bands Lat 36° 54' Long 46° 43'

Sunday the 31st

Strong winds with thunder
and rain spoke the Master of
New Bedford 14 months out
5000 sperm
Lat 35° 34' 46'
