Lat 36, 21 Long 2 6, 15

Wednesday the 7

N.E. S

Light winds at sunrise
kept off for land of St Mary
saw several said
Lat 36, 30 N

Thursday the 8th

fine weather with a good breeze
at 1 P.M. saw the ship Melacome
with her boats down chasing
Whales at 3 P.M. we hoisted
but got none they were going
to the windward like the D.C.
2 of the ships boat got fast
but lost the Whale the latter
part signals with rain

Friday the 9

commences with strong breeze
passed the Melacome saw Blackfish
Porpoises and Grampuses the latter
part of the day quite fine

Saturday September the 10th 1853

Course Wind
E.S.E. N

Light breeze and fine
weather spoke the Bothechilds of Boston
capt Small oil unknown
saw several others said the latter
part of the day kept off to the
Southward Lat Long

Sunday the 11th

S.W. W

Light breeze and fine weather
saw nothing of any account but
the Bothechilds bound the same
way we are

S.W. W

Lat 34, 16 N Long 24 33 W

Monday the 12

E.S.E. N.E. E

commences with light breeze but one
the increase at 4 P.M. commenced to
rain sunset furled the foresail
and foretop sail the latter part
of the day little more weather

E. S.W. E

Lat 34, 10 N Long 29 12 W

Tuesday the 13

E.S.E. N.E. E

commences with a strong
breeze saw Porpoises and
Blackfish and one said the
day end with a strong breeze
Lat 33, 23 N Long 21 34 W
