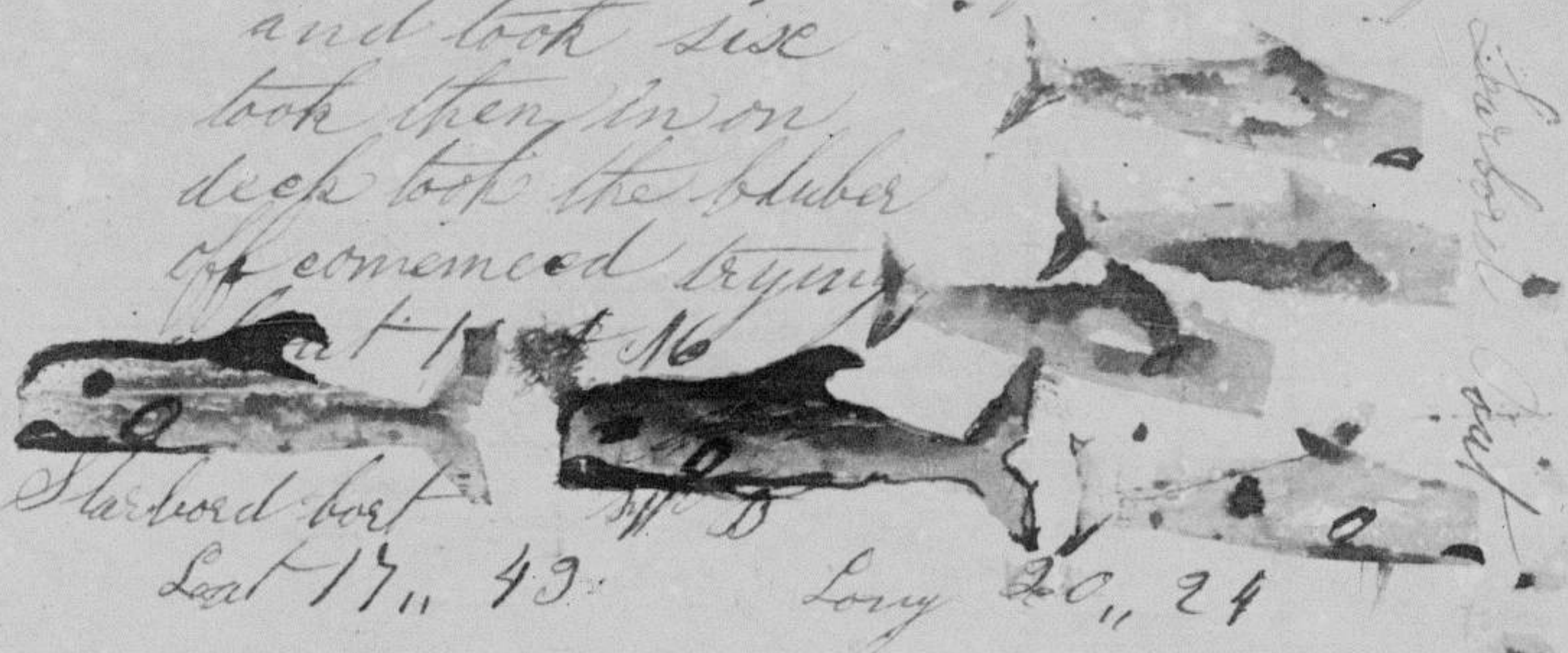


Friday September the 23rd 1853
 Good Winds light breeze through the day
 at 2 P.M. hoisted for blackfish
 and took six
 took them in on
 deck took the blubber
 off commenced trying
 at 11 P.M.
 Starboard port
 Lat 17° 43' Long 20° 24'



Saturday the 24th
 Every way commences with light wind
 excellent rain finished hailing out blackfish
 the cape saw several seals Porpoises
 crabs and Grampuses Broke out for
 water the latter part of the day
 strong breeze Lat Long

Sunday the 25th
 commences with Rain and at sundown
 saw the S of salt one of the Cape Verde
 in Lat 16° 45' Long 22° 56' W also
 Bonavista in Lat Long 22° 45' W
 the latter part of the day with fine
 weather Lat Long

Monday September the 26th 1853
 Light and baffling wind at 2
 P.M. hoisted away a boat and went
 on shore to see if there was any chance
 to get any water but the place
 being bad we caught some fish
 came on board and stood down
 towards St Vincent saw St Nicholas
 in Lat 16° 46' N Long

Tuesday the 27th light wind and fine
 weather Saw St Nicholas St
 Lucia St Antonio and St Vincent
 at 5 A.M. dropped our anchor in
 the harbor of St Vincent in the
 Lat 16° 59' N Long 25° 06' W
 there lay several all merchant men but
 the U.S. Brig of War Perry the
 latter part of the day with a squall
 in evening ship

Wednesday the 28th fine weather men employed
 in painting the starboard side and
 the brig Perry 2 cask of bread
 Thursday 29th men employed in painting
 at 4 P.M. the Greyhound came to
 anchor with 900 lbs. bound home from
 her
