the day rainy at 9 o'clock took our
anchors after putting our cable on
board the grey hound to go home
after getting a message by
the schooner of St. Louis James

Friday 7th fine weather saw Porpoise
saw several seals repaired the main sail
top sail

Lat 41° 55' W Long 25° 30'

Saturday 8th fine weather light breeze
saw several seals and Porpoises
men employed in repairing the
fore top sail broke out for water
saw several finbacks and seals
cottons
