

Wednesday January 11<sup>th</sup> 1854  
Course Wind Strong breeze through the day  
NE saw the Barkley hull  
causing off cap Roseo  
with Mooner and Lucha  
in site

Thursday 12<sup>th</sup>  
E strong breeze saw nothing

Friday 13<sup>th</sup> strong wind spook the  
Barkley saw the sparrows of  
Provincetown 9 months out  
180 sperm saw Humpbacks

Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> Strong breeze saw  
and looked for hump back but with  
out success saw the Barkley  
and Sparrows Cook of Provincetown

Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> Moderate breeze  
through the day saw Porpoise

Monday 16<sup>th</sup> into the Barkley  
set up the fly jib stay  
the day bred with a light  
breeze

Tuesday January 18<sup>th</sup> 55  
Fine weather saw the Barkley stood  
for Mooner at 3 P.M. shifted to  
the wind about 20 miles  
to the windward of mooner  
at sunrise kept off for sea  
steering to we could see so  
we came to anchor at 12 o'clock

Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup>  
sent men on shore to cut  
wood and a boat to go for fuel  
and a turtle and fished up  
several fish of Mahogany  
also got a lot of combs

Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> got up our wood  
and sent Tom Woods & Turbott  
got 2 sea turtles and 2 Bats  
loads of Mahogany

Friday 20<sup>th</sup> went for Mahogany and  
got quite a lot at 6 o'clock  
Took our stowage and stood for  
Lawn bay saw one Gull
