

Remarks on board in the harbor of
S. March 1st 1860

Begins with light winds from the
Southward with fine weather washing
to the Northward. Midday & latter
part the same one sail in sight
121 days out

Friday 2nd

Begins with light winds from the South
Plying to the Northward under all sail
Hauled up the cables and bent them and
got the Anchors off the bows at Sundown.
Came to off the harbor of Arica the Land
about 6 miles off stood off shore until 11
o'clock and then tacked in shore
122 days out

Saturday 3rd

Begins with light winds & fine weather
Laying off the harbor at 9 A.M. stood in
for the harbor at 2 P.M. came to anchor
in the harbor of Arica Peru commenced
getting the cables ready for water
123 days out

Sunday 4th

Begin with fine weather still laying
to anchor all hands employed in breaking
out trade for the captain lowered 2 boats
for Humbach but did not catch them
Latter part the captain ashore until
12 o'clock all hands waiting for him this
is the most disgusting Sunday that ever
passed by me or any body else to the world.
124 days out

Monday 5th

Still At anchor with fine weather all hands
employed in ship duty hands days wash
to day 125 days out

Arica on the Coast of Peru 1860
Tuesday 6th

Still At anchor good weather all hands
employed in ship duty Lowered one Boat for
A hump Back but without success
126 days out

Wednesday 7th

Still At Anchor good weather all hands
employed in painting Ship and getting
Ashore trade hard Bred & meat &c
A port supper so ends another day of our
discontent 127 days out

Thursday 8th

Still At Anchor good weather all hands
employed in fitting rigging & getting ashore
trade 128 days out

Friday 9th

Still at Anchor good weather all hands
employed in getting ready for sea 3 men
took a French leave At 11 P.M. took our
Anchors & stood out of the harbor 1 P.M. the
Capt & boats crew went on shore for the
Barranway's and stayed all night the ship
Laying off on the mate lowered for A hump
Back went up to one and lanced him but
did not stop him Latter part calm so ends
129 days out

Saturday 10th

Laying off the harbor the Capt still ashore
light hailing winds fine weather 4 P.M.
The Boat not in sight tacked Ship and stood
off 1/2 hour the Land about 8 miles dist
The latter part light air and calm plenty
of Hump Backs in sight so ends
130 days out
