

Remarks on Board off the harbor
Sunday 11th

Begins with light air from the South
wind with fine weather still laying off
And on the harbor 1 o'clock B. M. stood in
to the harbor and the Capt. came off tack
Ship and stood off the last 48 hours
have took some comfort while the capt
is on shore for I have not seen any the
last 3 months Middle & Lattas part good
Breezes and fine weather 10 P.M. tacked
In shore I turned in to get some sleep but
could not for the capt making such a
noise crying and counting, or his money
This shows how he tal keeps the Sabbath
131 days out

Monday 12th
Begins light air from the Southward so
A. M. stood in for the harbor the capt & Boat
Even went on shore the ship laying off and
At 6 O. M. the Boat came off with out the
Capt made all sail heading off shore 2 P.M.
The wind all left us were around in shore
and dropped Anchors in 14 fathoms of water
and filled the sails and passed at night
In peace and comfort so ends this day
133 days out

Tuesday 13th
Begins with light air & calm laying at
Anchors about 5 miles from the Land At
10 A.M. the Boat went in for the capt
1 P.M. returned with the capt & the 3
Runaways took our Anchors and beate
Us into the harbor came to Anchors again
for the purpose of trading we have
feared away 10 day here all ready is not
the to much to bare scant ned's want
133 days out

of Arica coast of Peru March 1860

Wednesday 14th
Begins with light air and calm good
Weather laying at Anchors in the harbor
Of Arica the Capt ashore drinking &
And cursing and all hands on board
The Ship tied up like dogs he came
Off and broke out for Tobacco to smuggle
Ashore but they did not come for it
And I was glad of it so ends
134 days out

Thursday 15th
Begins with Still At Anchors calm
And good weather The Mate and my
self went to the capt for our discharge
For as for living some can not and
Will not any longer then we can better
Cross off 10 A.M. the trades winds sprang
Up we took our Anchors & put to sea
Stowed the Anchors & cables and cleared
Up decks fine Breeze Steering W by S
Lattas part calm so ends another day
Of misery Hope and pray that this
Went last A grate while
135 days out

Friday 16th
Begins with light air and calm
Fine weather Steering W by S the Land
About 20 miles off Middle & Lattas
Light Breezes employed in Blanking the
Anchors and Painting the Boats saw some
Thump Backs & one sail the Land about 30
Miles off in the morning mended the
Mizen Topgalant sail one of the runaways
Still in loss Bought 15 pounds of English
Walnuts of the Capt. so ends this day of misery
136 days out
