to the NW and then about 1000 latter
part winds from the S changed to
the SE Sat Aug 30 1852

First part moderate breeze from
the S and plying clouds headed by
to the N.E. at sunset tacked to the
N. middle and latter part squalls
from the N.E. cleared off by 9.10.
