Remarks on board Monday Feb 19th 1838

First part a moderate breeze at E and pleasant steered N by W under all sail.
Latter part a fresh gale from E to ESE and pleasant steered N by W under all sail at 10 AM only
one sail in sight steering at 10 AM a small boat by measuring the dist of the sun from
the moon
Lat by Obs 15° 20' South

Remarks on board Tuesday Feb 20th 1838

First part a fine breeze from ESE to SE and pleasant steered N by W under all
sail the above mentioned sail in sight. Latter part a fresh gale at ESE and squally
steered N by W. part strong trades at E and clear steered N

Lat by Obs 12° 20' South

Remarks on board Wednesday Feb 21st 1838

Day commenced with moderate trades at E and pleasant steered N under all sail
Lat by Obs 11° 20' South

Remarks on board Thursday Feb 22nd 1838

First part a moderate breeze at E and pleasant steered N under all sail one sail in sight
steering to the S.W. Latter part moderate trades at E and pleasant steered N all hands
employed working. The ship and other duty 2 sails in sight Lat by Obs 9° 45' South

Remarks on board Friday Feb 23rd 1838

First part light breeze at E and pleasant steered N about the cables at 10 AM and the land
to the westward of Cape Horn 2 sails in sight and a number of fishing boats. Latter
part a light breeze from E to ESE and pleasant steered N by E. Latter part a light breeze and
sail so worked to this Northward under all sail one ship and plenty of boats in sight broke
out 1/2 m. and flour at noon C St Augustin bore N by E 1/2 N compass dist 4 miles
Lat by Obs 8° 23' South

Remarks on board Saturday Feb 24th 1838

First part a moderate breeze at E by E and pleasant steered towards Pernambuco under
all sail quite near the land at 7 AM. Pernambuco one ship and a number of boats
in sight. Latter part a moderate breeze tacked off. Latter part light air and variable with
squalls and calms 3 ships in sight at 3 AM anchored in Pernambuco road in 1/2 m. water

Remarks on board Sunday Feb 25th 1838

First part a light breeze and variable one boat in sight. Latter part a light breeze at E
and pleasant one watch on shore on liberty a number of sails in sight at 8 AM the ship
Panama of Bay Harbor anchored in the road 2 1/2 m. out with 300 lbs. of whale
and 100 lbs. of oil

Remarks on board Monday Feb 26th 1838

First part a light breeze at E and pleasant a number of sails in the offing one watch on shore
on liberty. Latter part the same.

Remarks on board Tuesday Feb 27th 1838

First part a light breeze at E and pleasant one watch on shore on liberty. Latter part a light
breeze and variable with pleasant weather a number of sails in the offing at 6 AM the ship Canamach
weighed anchor and put to sea at 7 AM one boat went on shore for recruits at 11 AM John Stynes and
James of Cape Horn green land and James J. Lawrence steered to a boat and set of sails and
sail and deserted

Remarks on board Wednesday Feb 28th 1838

First part a moderate breeze at E and pleasant at 3 AM the boat came off with fruit at 4 AM the
Captain went on shore and got a permit from the American Consul to discharge Charles Thos second.
State for abusive language to the Captain and other mutinous threats by paying the lawful fear for
discharging men at 7 AM came on board. Latter part light air and variable with calms. Latter part a light
breeze and variable with pleasant weather at 10 AM carried the second watch on shore and delivered
him to the Consul at 11 AM weighed anchor and put to sea a number of sails in sight steered the anchor
in the bow and steered the cables below at noon the land in sight Lat by Obs 5° 09' South

Remarks on board Thursday March 1st 1838

First part a fine breeze at E and pleasant steered ESE under all sail one ship and a number of
fishing boats in sight at 6 AM tacked and steered N at midnight tacked and steered ESE. Latter part
a moderate breeze at E and pleasant 3 sails in sight at 10 AM saw a large sperm whale at 9
put off struck the whale and the line parted 1 No Obs

Remarks on board Friday March 2nd 1838

First part a moderate breeze at E and pleasant at 1 PM came to the ship hoisted the
land and there at 2 PM under all sail 2 ships in sight at 7 AM tacked ship and steered ESE the land
in sight at midnight tacked and steered N under ESE. Latter part a moderate breeze at E and pleasant
steered N by W the land in sight at 10 AM tacked ship and steered ESE 2 ships in sight and the
lying jib and set it Lat by Obs 4° 48' South

Remarks on board Saturday March 3rd 1838

First part a light breeze at E and pleasant steered ESE under all sail one ship in sight at 6 AM took
in the fore top gallant sail at 2 AM tacked ship and steered N by W broke out for water

Lat by Obs 8° 00' South
