

Journal of a Whaling Voyage in the Atlantic
Remarks on board Thursday June 14th 1838
Commenced with Fresh Breezes from W by S
and pleasant Bours East by South 3 Sails
in sight at 4 finished the Topgalant Rigging
& sent the Mast up & set the Sail the latter
part Fresh Gale at 9 took abaner Obs by Long
curved forward to noon was 45.40 Lat 37.24

Remarks Friday June 15th
Commenced with Fresh Gales from W by S
& Squally Bours S by E at 6 took in Fore
Topgalant Sail at 9 took in Staring Sails
& Main Topgalant Sail at midnight Wind
W by S at 12 Wind N East at 6 at 11 set the 4th
S by Gile & Topgalant sails Light Breeze from
W by S and pleasant at 9 took a Luner Obs Long
deduced therefrom 44.20 by Chron 44.15 Lat 37.04

Remarks Saturday June 16th
Commenced with light Breezes from North-eastward
& pleasant Bours S by E at 4 broke out the Fore
hold for Water at 6 set the Fore Topmast
stearingsail a very heavy smell from Westward
at 5 at 11 set down the Fore Royal mast and
yard and Topgalant mast the latter part all
hands employed fitting the Topgalant & Royal
Rigging Wind W by S at 9 took a Luner
Obs Long deduced therefrom Long by Chron 42.25
Lat 37.45 N

Remarks on board Sunday June 17th
Commenced with light Breezes from N by W Bours
S by South all hands employed on the Topgalant
& Royal rigging at 6 sent up the Topgalant
Mast & crossed the yard at 10 Wind W by S
shifted the stearingsail over Breeze freshened at
6 at 11 strong Breezes from West at 8 saw
white water ahead S ends
Lat 37.34 Long by Chron 39.39 W

Remarks Monday June 18th
Commenced with Fresh Breezes from W by S Bours S by E
at 8 took in the Fore Topmast Stearingsail a thick
fog at 6 at 11 Bours S by the fog cleared off but
squally 2 Sails in sight sent up the Fore Royal
mast so ends Lat 37.41 Long by Chron 39.39 W

Remarks on board the Barque George Washington Capt. White
Remarks Tuesday June 19th 1838
Commenced with Fresh Breezes from W by S Bours East
2 Sails in sight at 11 took in sail to
double reefed Topsails Bours S by E and squally
at 4 at 11 set all sail Bours East the latter part
employed repairing the Main Topsail at 7 at 11
shifted over the Topmast Stearingsail Wind W by S
Lat 38.12 Long 33.57 West by Chron

Remarks Wednesday June 20th
Fresh Gales from W by S Bours East and
Squally employed repairing the Main Topsail
and fitting the blocks aloft at 8 took in sail
to double reefed Topsails Bours S by E at 10 added
the Ship to the Wind to Southward at 3 1/2 at 11
set the Topsail & turned the reefs out the
Topsails Bours East the latter part foggy at 10
double reefed the Topsails & reefed to Wind
to Southward so ends a thick fog & rainy
Lat by account 38.30 Long by ac 32.00 W

Remarks Thursday June 21st
Commenced with Fresh Breezes from West steering
by the wind to Southward a thick fog
with squalls of rain at 8 wore Ship to
Northward the Middle part wore moderate
but foggy at 6 at 11 set all sail Bours S by E
at 11 a Sail in sight steering to Eastward at 7 tacked
Ship to S East at 10 took in Topgalant sails
and S by Gile & tacked Ship to N Westward
Wind S by W at 12 past 12 saw a Ship of the
S by W steering Eastward very foggy
ends Lat 39.03 Long 31.50 by Chron

Remarks Friday June 22^d
Commenced with fresh Gales & foggy in front then
tacked ship to Eastward at 9 the fog cleared off set
the stearingsails & Topgalant Sails S by E Bours
S by North at 6 made the land but island of
St. Thomas bearing E by S the above ship of the barbed
bow at 8 took in the Lower Stearing Sail at 10
took in Topmast Stearing Sail & set the Ship to
the wind to S East wind S by E & squally took in
Topgalant sails Gile & Main sail & double reefed the
Topsails the Land bearing N by E at 11 at 12
at 11 took in the Fore Topsails & Mainsail at 12 sail of
the Sea Bore at 7 wore Ship to Southward wind
