

Remarks on board Friday July 20th 1838.
Fresh Gale from East & Squally steering
Northward at 5 saw several Breaches of the
weather Quarter tacked Ship at 6 took in
Sail at midnight tacked Ship the latter part
made Sail so ends Scurra bearing S S W
Dist 20 miles

Remarks Saturday July 21st
Fresh Gale from North steering by the Wind
to Northwestward at 7 spoke
the Schooner Scituate of Hudson & no other
no Oil another sail to windward took in
Sail at 4 it made Sail a sail in sight
astern very Squally so ends no land in sight
Sat 39 46 Long by

Remarks Sunday July 22^d
Commenced light Breeze from N East and
pleasant at 5 saw a shoal of Spum Whales
lowered the Boats at 6 saw a shoal of killers
standing the Whales at 7 Boats come on board
got nothing headed to Eastward at midnight
more Ship the latter part calm with light
Breeze

Remarks Monday July 23^d
Commenced light Breeze from S S W
squally saw 3 Sails headed to Eastward
the middle part fresh Gale & pleasant cours
W by North the latter part rainy

Remarks Tuesday 24th
First part fresh Gale and rainy cours
W by North Wind S S W at 7 saw a shoal
of Blackfish lowered 2 Boats at 2 Boats
come on board got nothing at 5 made Scurra
bearing W N W Dist 25 miles saw 3 Sails
at 7 tacked Ship at 1 it tacked Ship
at 3 saw Ship to Windward. In the
the latter part pleasant 2 Sails in sight
so ends Scurra bearing W by N Dist 10 miles

Remarks on board Wednesday July 25th 1838
First part calm with a very light Breeze
from Westward and pleasant at 1 saw
a large Ship lowered the Boat and took
it on board 3 Sails in sight at 2
Scurra Whales in sight Scurra bearing S S W
Dist 8 miles

Remarks Thursday July 26th
Light Breeze from S Westward steering
Tribant courses several sails in sight the latter
part sent down the Main Topgalant and Royal
Masts & yards saw several shoals of Grampuses
and 3 Sails Scurra bearing S S W Dist 15 miles

Remarks Friday July 27th
First part light Breeze from Westward
steering Northward all hands employed fitting
the Main Topgalant & Royal Masts & Rigging
4 Sails in sight at 4 sent them up the Masts
saw the hull of a Brig or Schooner Capt
Whitens went on board of her at 6 returned
her Deck level with the water at 6 it sent
up the Main Topgalant yard & Sail and set
it and sent up the Royal yard so ends
Sat 20 30 Long by the 31 1838

Remarks Saturday July 28th
Fresh Breeze from Northward & Squally
steering Westward at 6 took took in Sail
Wind W by N at 6 it made all Sail
the latter part calm Sat 41 00 Long by the 32 30 1838

Remarks Sunday July 29th
First part fresh Gale from S S W & Squally
cours S S W at 7 took in Sail and move
the Main Topgalant to the Mast the latter part
Strong Gale took in the Mainsail & Scurra
er Dist 41 16 Lat Long by account 32 35 W
