

Journal of a Whaling voyage on board the Barque George

Remarks on board Thursday August 9th 1838

Light Gale from S West and pleasant at 2
Sheered out to Southward by the wind to Westward
clear of the land at 3 o'clock tacked Ship to S East
the first and latter part 4 sails in sight so ends
Pico bearing N East Dist 25 miles employed stowing
Water and getting provisions out

Remarks Friday August 10th

Light Gale from S West steering S East by the
Wind 3 Sails in sight the first ^{part} employed stowing
the latter ^{part} ~~employed~~ ^{employed} stowing
Pico bearing N East Dist 25 miles Long by Chron 27 30th
filled up 4 bbls with potatoes and Onions for Pickles

Remarks Saturday August 11th

Light Breeze from S West and pleasant &
steering by the wind to Southward 3 sails
in sight at 9 o'clock spoke the Piche of
Nantucket Capt Allen Capt Whitens
went on board so ends

Lat 36 17 N Long by Chron 26 30

Remarks Sunday August 12th

Light Breeze from S West steering
South at 6 o'clock spoke the ~~Monmouth~~
of Cold Spring Capt ^{at 10} Capt
Whitens returned the latter part calm so ends
Lat 35 35 Long by Chron 25 30

Remarks Monday August 13th

The first part calm and very warm 3 sails
in sight at 2 o'clock light Breeze from S
Eastward steering S Westward at 10 wind
S West tacked Ship Lat 35 14 Long by Chron 25 11
painted the boat spare boat

Washington Capt J Whitens in the Atlantic Ocean

Remarks on board Tuesday August 14th 1838

These 24 hours light air from West to S West
6 Ships in sight ahead & off the Starboard beam
steering by the Wind to Southward till 10 o'clock
when the Wind hauled to Southward lower
S S W so ends Lat 34 36 N Long by Chron 24 59
put the boat on the larboard Quarter and took in
the Larboard Boat

First part fresh Breeze from N East the
paint the boat 6 Ships in sight ahead the latter
part 4 Sails in sight at Meridian the
Ship Washington saw a School of Spum
Whales Lat 32 41 Long by Chron 25 00 West

Remarks Thursday August 16

Fresh Gale from N East and pleasant 4 Ships
in sight at 2 past Mer saw the Whales 4
Ships with their Boats after the Whales at 3
o'clock lowered the Lar Boats at 6 Boats come
on board spoke the Washington of Sag Harbor
Capt Sayer Capt Sayer come on board at 7th
returned down South set the Topmast
steering sail at 8 o'clock set the Topgallant
and lower steering sail 4 Sails in sight
so ends Lat 30 28 North Long 25 00 by Chron

Remarks Friday August 17th

Fresh Gale from N East lower S by W
West 5 sails in sight at 8 o'clock took in
the Waist Boat and ^{put} another over on the main
so ends Fresh Breeze & pleasant
Lat 28 00 Long by Chron 24 53
