

Journal of a Whaling voyage in the Atlantic  
Remarks on board Sunday Sept 25<sup>th</sup> 1838

First part Fresh Breezes from N E to S E and pleasant steering by the wind to Southward employed setting up the lead stays and fitting the stays broke out the after hold for butter and started a cask of water Sat 26 34 Long by Chron 32 05 by Subair 32 20

Remarks Wednesday Sept 26<sup>th</sup>  
First part calm the middle part light breeze from Eastward came S E the latter part calm all hands employed painting Ship and taring down rigging so ends Sat 27 15 Long by Chron 32 06

Remarks Thursday Sept 27<sup>th</sup>  
Light breeze from Westward and pleasant Coars S E all hands employed painting Ship and taring down rigging the latter part squally the wind shifted to E Eastward at 10 AM tacked Ship and took in the Fore Topgallantsail <sup>so ends</sup> Sat 28 30 South Long by Chron 31 35 West

Remarks Friday Sept 28<sup>th</sup>  
Fresh Gale from E Eastward and squally steering by the wind from S W to South the watch employed taring and fitting rigging the middle part wind veered to East steering by the wind to Southward the latter part wind from S E East to N E Coars E East the watch employed painting spars and felling rigging several Spinbacks so ends 29 45 South Long by Chron 30 45 West

for Eight Whales

Remarks Friday Oct 5<sup>th</sup> 1838  
First part Fresh Gale from N E to S E and squally steering S E a sail of the Sea at 4 finished repairing the Foresails at 5 took in the Fore Top Sail <sup>and from 5 till the night</sup> the latter part set all sail employed breaking out the after hold and unbolting the Chain Top sail and bent the old one so ends Sat 34 57 South Long by Chron 33 25 West

Remarks Saturday Oct 6<sup>th</sup>  
First part Fresh Breeze from N W Coars E by S at 2 saw Eight Whales going to windward very quick at 3 unbolting the Fore Top sail and bent the old one and <sup>put</sup> the others on calks and stowed the after hold off at 4 finished stowing and took in sail at 2 AM took in the Fore Sail and luffed to wind to Westward at 6 AM set the Fore sail and Fore Top sail saw a Sperm Whale at the latter part Coars S E employed repairing the Foresail so ends Sat 36 06 Long by Chron 22 37

Remarks Sunday Oct 7<sup>th</sup>  
First part Fresh Gale from N E to S E steering by the wind to E Eastward at 3 took in the Fore Top sail saw Spermbacks at 6 took in the Foresail the middle and latter part a Gale from N W by W & raining laying to heave to Northward so ends
