Remarks on board Monday Oct 15th

First part Light Breeze and rainy
the middle and latter parts Fresh Breeze
from Northward set the Foresail
Lat South

Remarks Tuesday Oct 16th

First part Light Breeze from Northward
and rainy Steering to Westward at 5
more Ship 2 sails in sight took
out the after hold for beef and molasses
the latter part made all sail. one sail in
sight took out for 4 four beams and apples
and small stores took out the sad room
dried the sails and stowed the light sails
in calks at other more ship so ends

Remarks Wednesday Oct 17th

First part Fresh Breeze from NW
West and pleasant stowed of the after
hold and sailroom the latter part one
sail in sight saw Pinbacks at
after lowered 2 Boats and chased the
Whales so ends

Long by Chron 21 18 West

Remarks Thursday Oct 18th

Fresh Breeze from N Westward
steering diverant courses at 4 past
other Boats come on board bore all
the fore hold for water saw Pinbacks
at 4 had a squall of rain took
in sail the latter part set all sail 2
sails in sight at 10 finished the
Foresail and unbuttoned the one aloft
and bent the old one so ends

cruising for Right Whales

Remarks Friday Oct 19th 1838

Fresh Gale and squally steering
diverant courses at 4 past other same
X Right Whales lowered the Boats and
chased them at 4 Boats come on
board got nothing at 6 took in
sail the latter part made all sail at 7
at 8 saw Right Whales lowered and
struck from drawn at 9 Boats come
X one board broke out the fore hold for
rigging and jib unbent the jib and
bent the other so ends

Long by Chron 21 05 West

Remarks Sat Oct 20th

First part light air from Southward
stowed the Foresail jib and Sappalant sail
X in calks and stowed off the fore hold
new Tavit fully same Right Whales
at 2 lowered the Boats at 4 come on
board at 6 took in sail the latter part
Fresh Breeze from Eastward at 6 took
set all sail but the Sappalant sail
at 8 sent down the Sappalant yard
and sail to repair so ends one sail in
sight rainy Lat 34 48 South

Long by Chron 22 06

Remarks Sunday Oct 21st

First part Fresh Gale from East
and squally steering West 3 sails
in sight at 5 bent Sappalant sail
and sent the yard and sail aloft
at 6 took in sail and heaved to
at Eastward the middle and latter part
calm and rainy 2 sails in sight
