Remarks on board Monday Oct 22 1838
First part light air from the Eastward
and rainy, set the Gile and Spoutee
at 5 took them in and wore ship
to Northward 8 sails in sight the
latter part ^{made all sail} steering different courses sent
a trysail 2 sails in sight saw Sinker's
Lat South Long by Chron 22 14 W

Remarks Tuesday Oct 23^d
First part Fresh Gale from Northward
steering different courses saw Sinker's.
6 sails in sight at 6 took in sail
the middle part squally the latter
part set sail 4 sails in sight
Lat 34 47 South
Long by Chron 21 15 W
by Sunn Obs 21 23 West.

Remarks Wednesday Oct 24th
Fresh Breeze from N Westward
and pleasant steering different courses
2 sails in sight saw Sinker's at 6
took in sail at 6 A.M. made
sail wind to Westward 2 sails in
sight saw Sinker's at 11^h lowered the
Boats Lat 34 43 South

Remarks Thursday 25th
Light Breeze from Westward and
pleasant at 4 boats came on board
at 6 took in sail at 8 A.M.
made all sail saw Sinker's
Lat 34 49 Long by Chron 20 49 Long by Sunn 20 55

Remarks Friday Oct 26th
First part light Breeze from Northward
steering different courses saw Sinker's at 1
lowered the Boats at 2 Boats came on board at 6
took in sail the latter part a Gale at 8 set
the fore topsail close reefed at 10 took it in and
lowered the sails Lat 35 19 South broke out for
bay Park and water

cruising for Right Whales

Remarks on board Saturday Oct 27th 1838
First part a Gale from Northward and
sandy the middle part squally the latter
light wind to Westward wore ship and
set the foresail and topsail
Lat 35 35

Remarks Sunday Oct 28th
A Gale from Northward headed to
Eastward took in the fore topsail at
7 A.M. wore ship to Westward
a sail in sight at 9^h spoke the
Commodore Decatur of New Bedford
Capt Wood came on board at 11^h
took in the foresail so ends

Remarks Monday Oct 29th
First part a Gale from Northward
at 4 it moderated Capt Wood went
on board the middle and latter parts light
Breeze made all sail 2 sails in sight
saw Sinker's so ends
Lat 36 02 South
Long by Chron 20 52 West

Remarks Tuesday Oct 30th
First part Fresh Breeze and pleasant
at 1^h spoke the Ship Meteor of
Lyton Capt ^{5th months} 4 Whales
Capt Whitens went on board at 7 returned
took in sail and wore ship to
Northward Wind N W by West the
latter part a Gale from NW 38
Lat 35 51 Long by Chron 20 08 W
one sail in sight

Remarks Wednesday Oct 31st
A Gale from Westward trying to Northward
one sail in sight the latter part set the
foresail and sent the fore stowsail so ends
saw Sinker's Lat 35 11 Long by Chron 19 58
